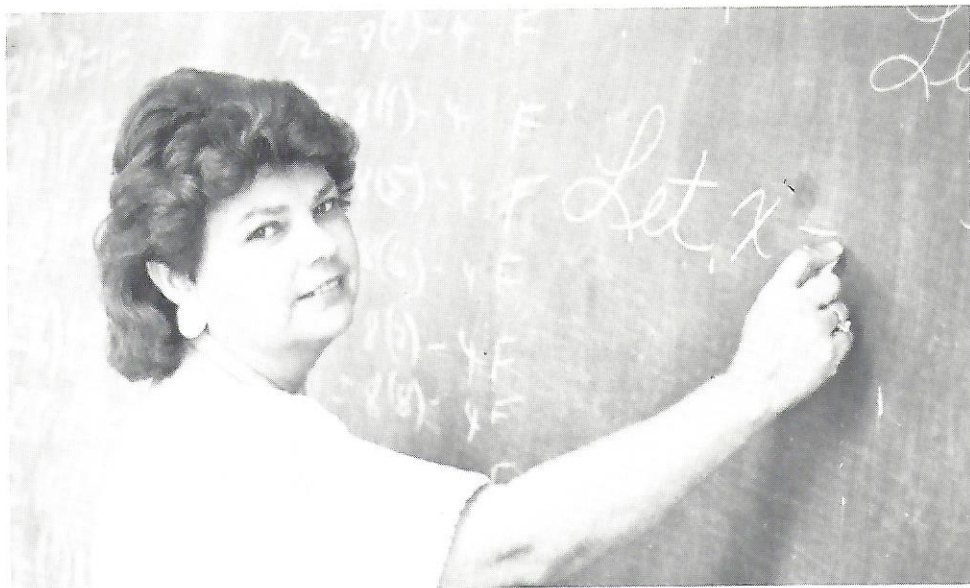

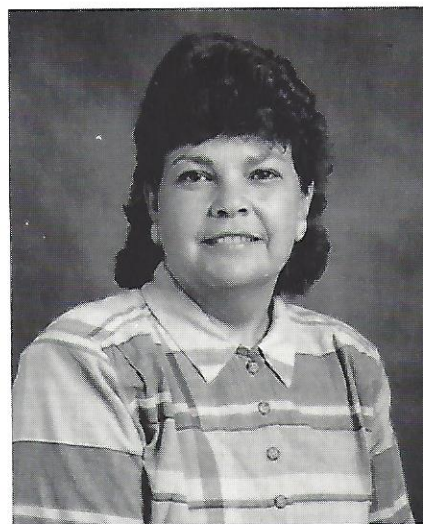

Buddy Sandifer



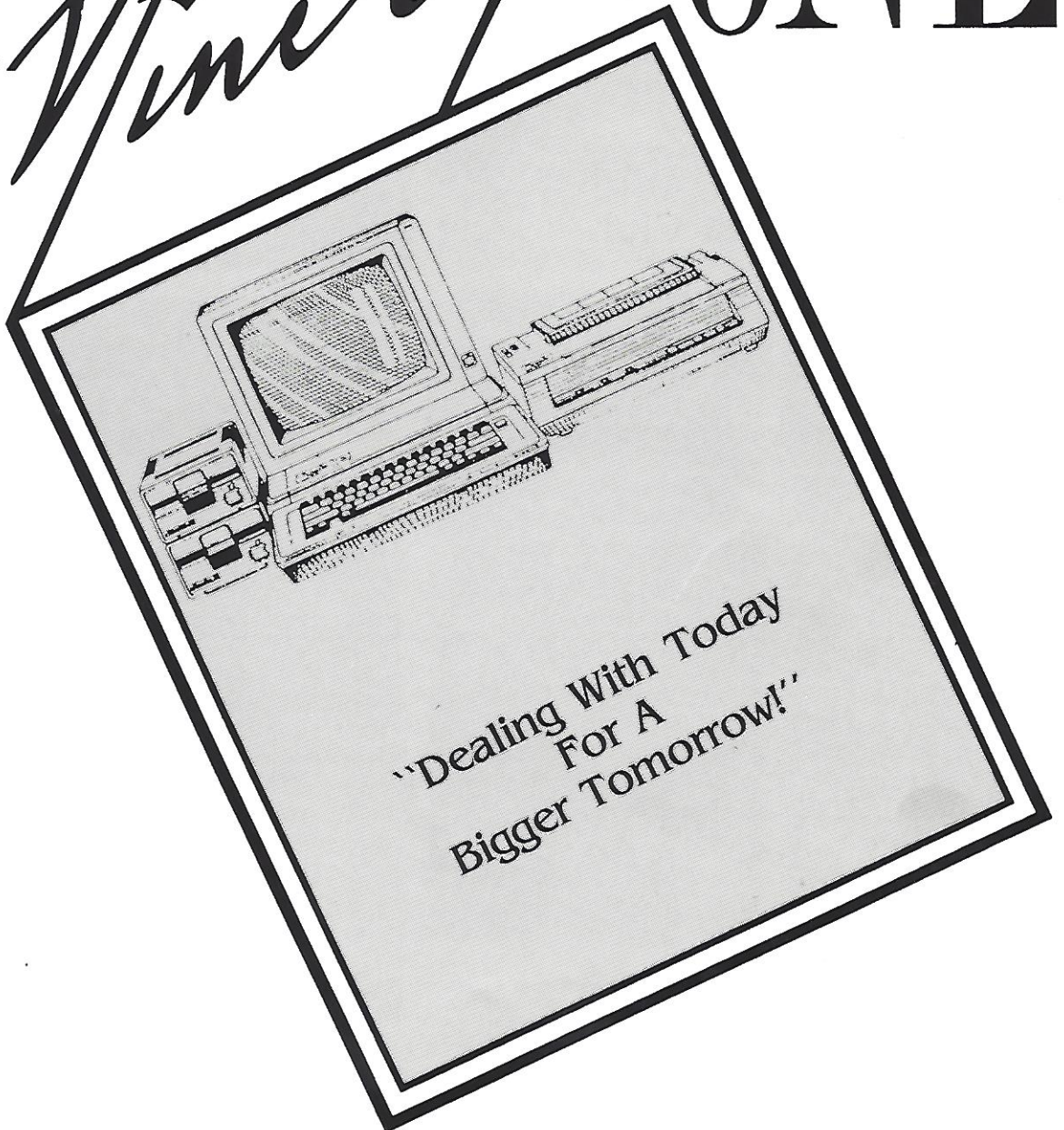

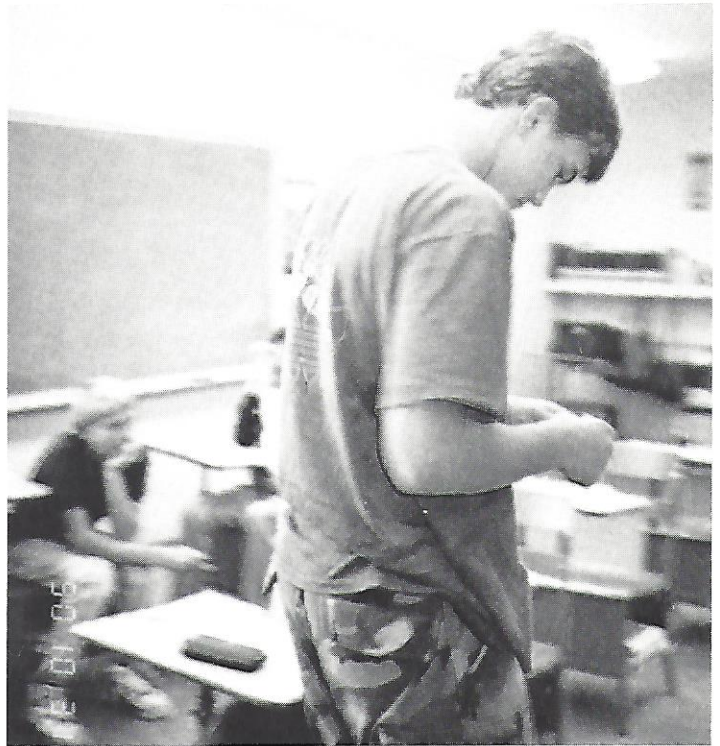


Dealing With Weekends

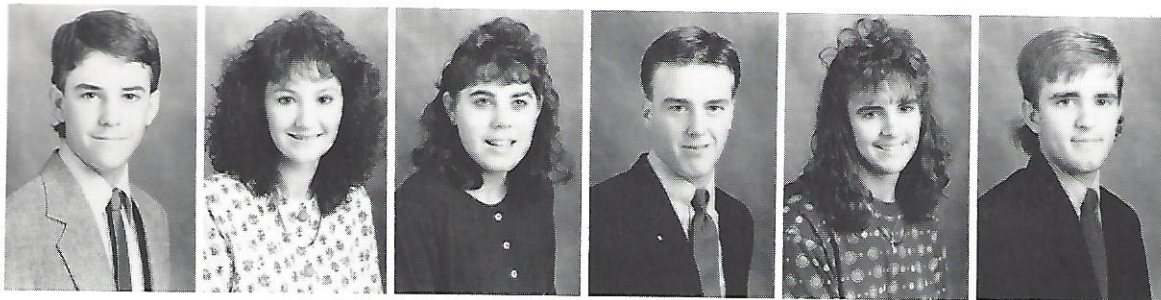


School Traditions

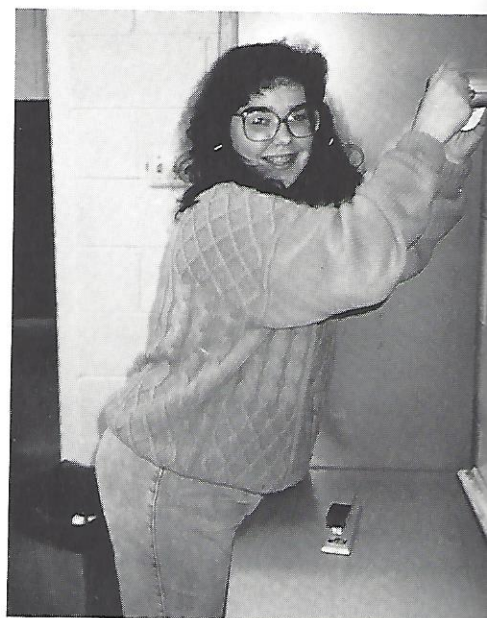

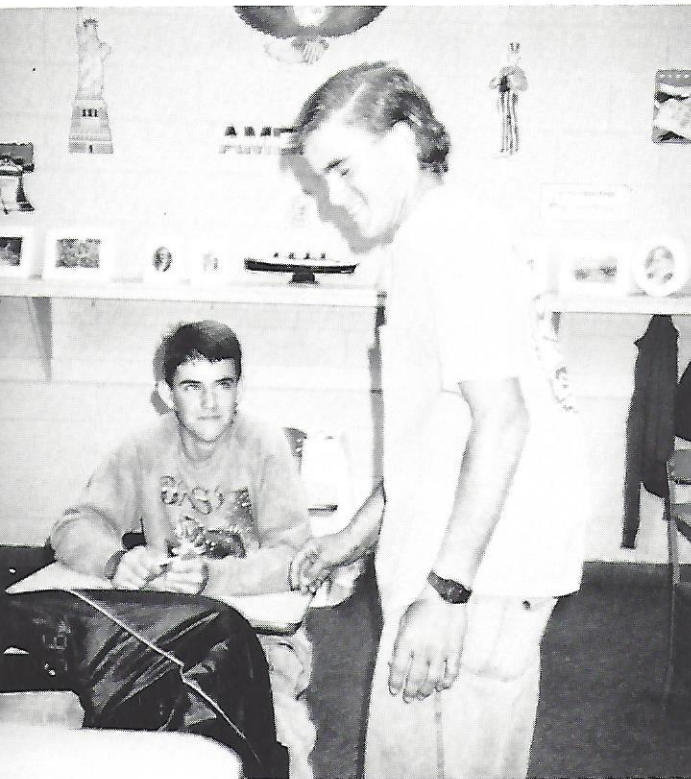
Having School Spirit



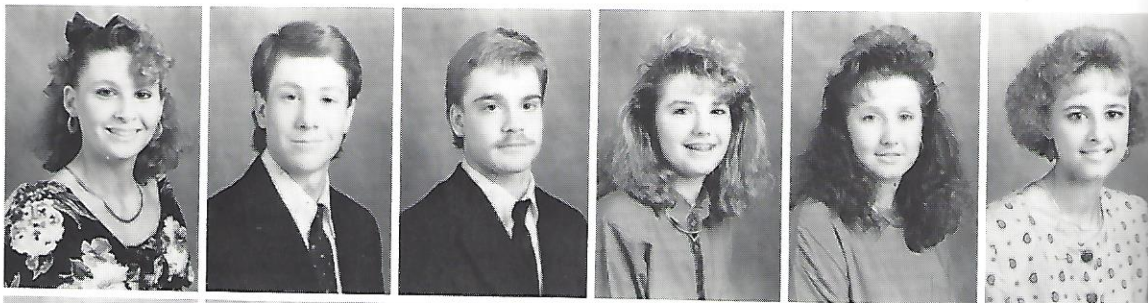

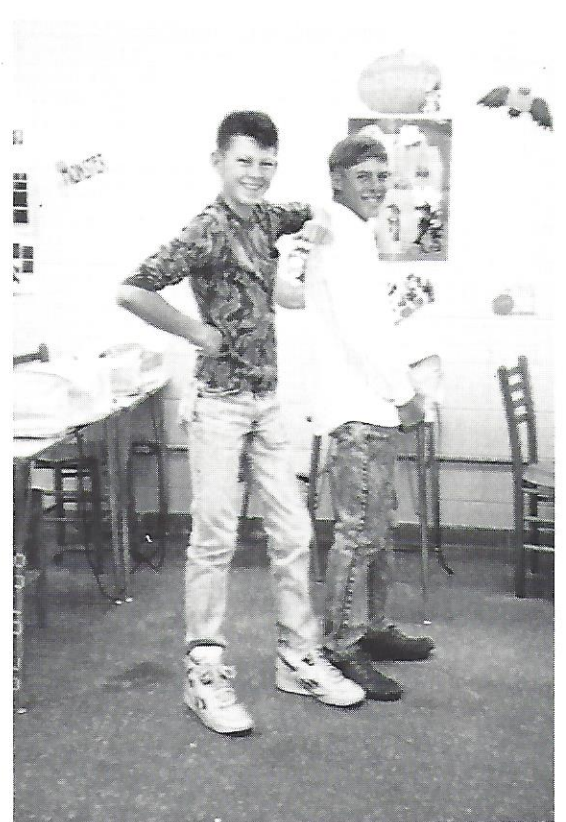


As a new school year comes around so does a fresh group of Juniors. Two important activities a Junior participates in is buying their class rings and preparing the prom.

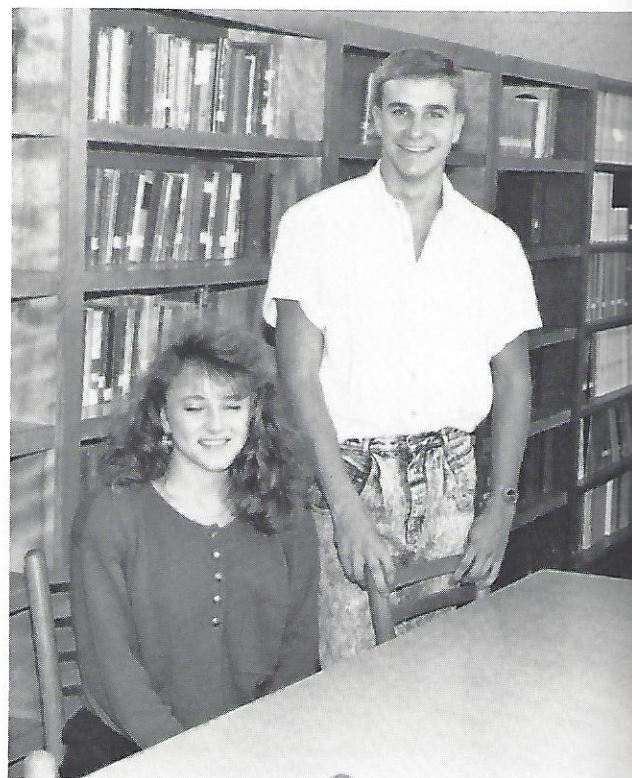
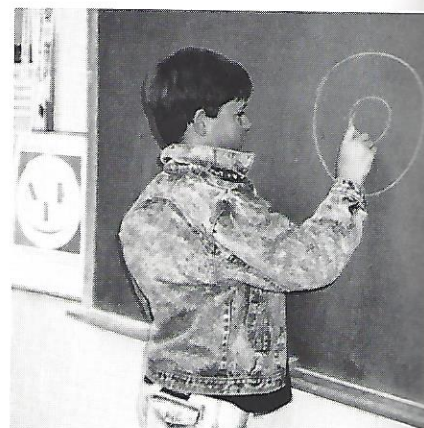

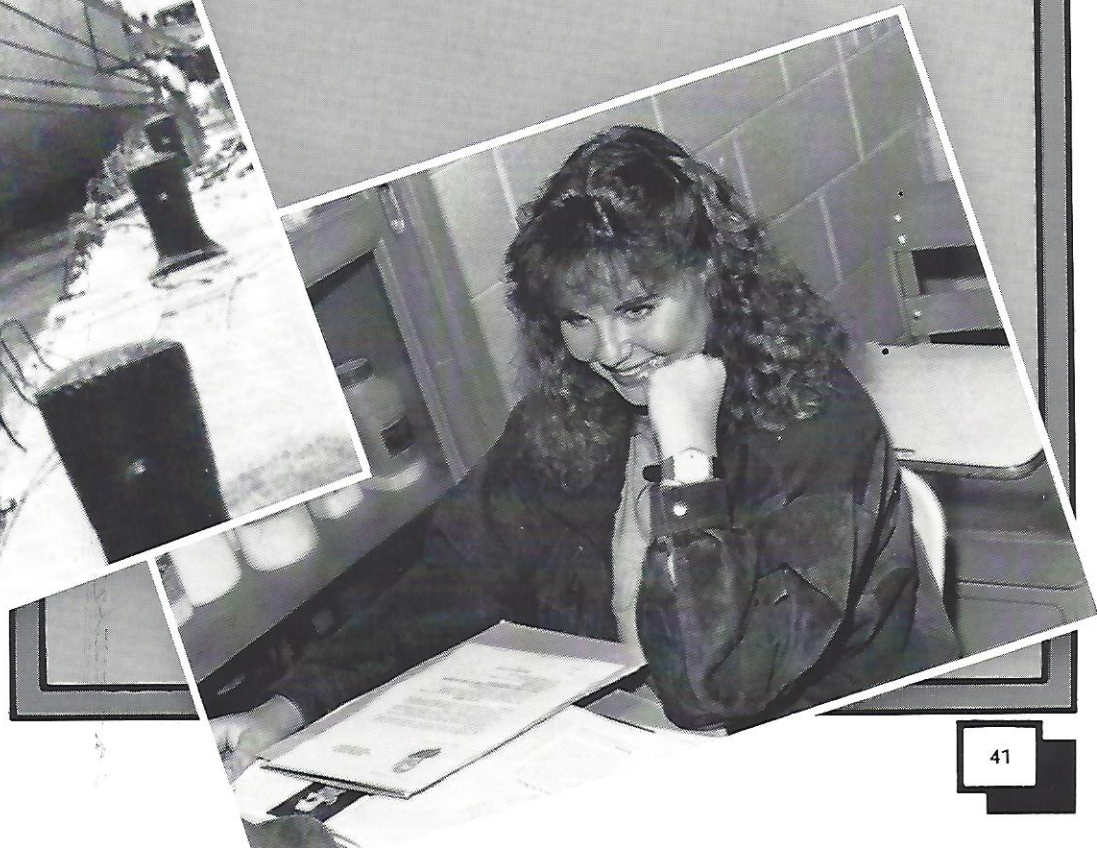


WHAT'S THE BIG DEAL ABOUT BEING A SENIOR?

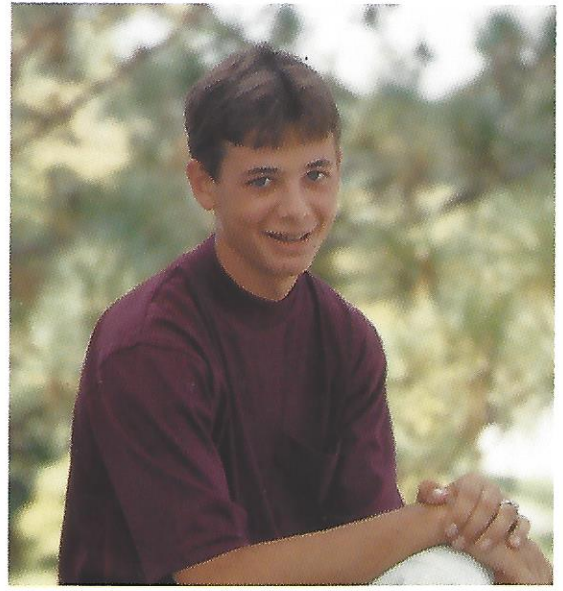

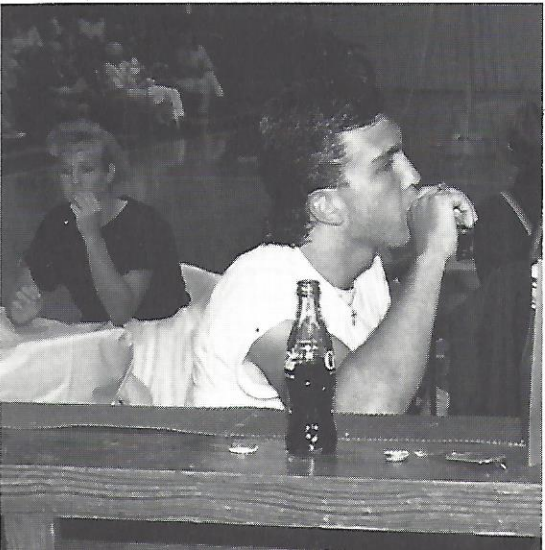
The Fabulous 50's
