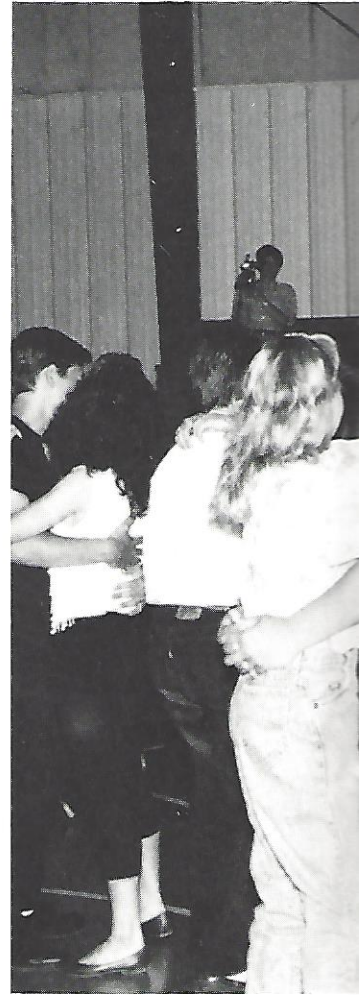
## Fooling Around

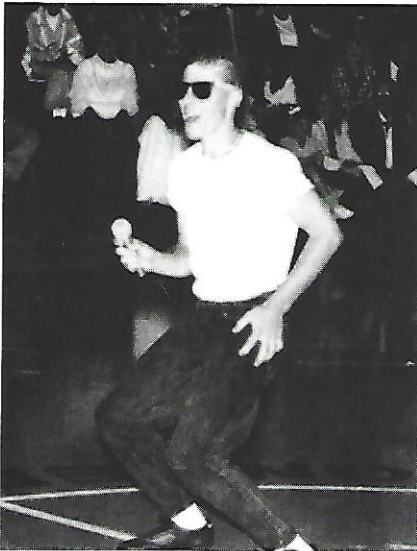

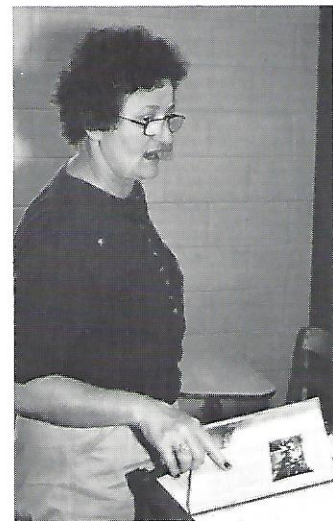
## Out To Work

## The Beginning

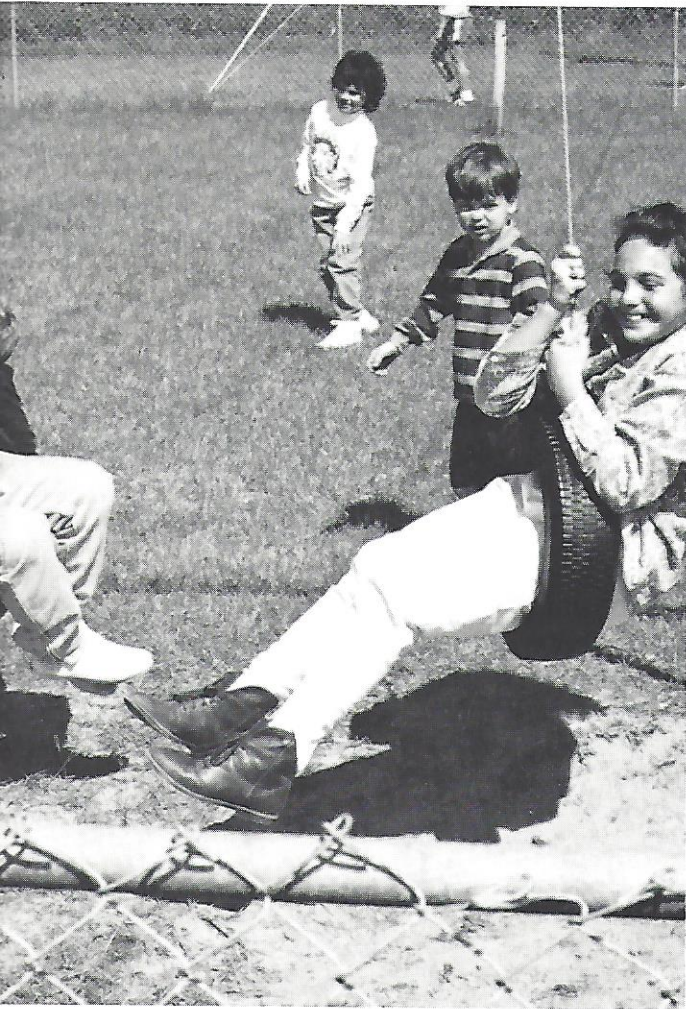

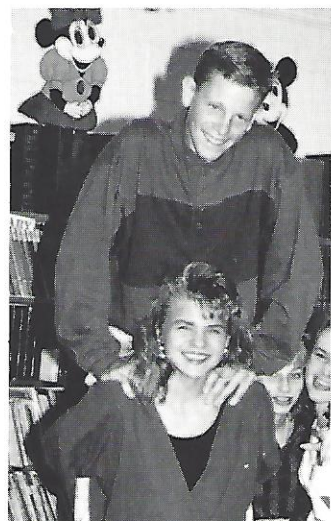
## Out Of Words

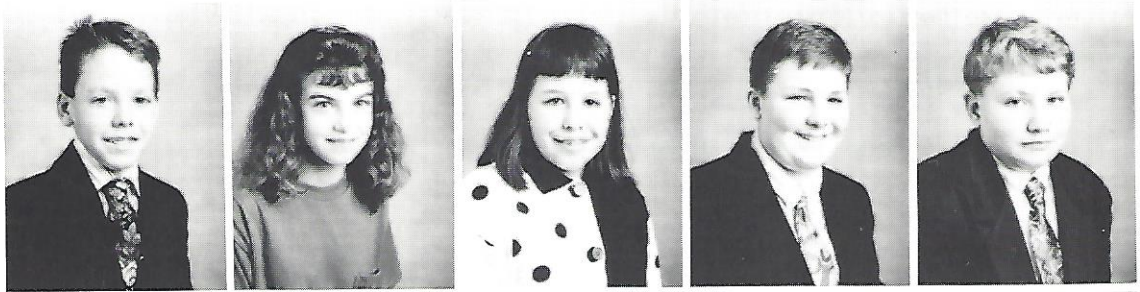

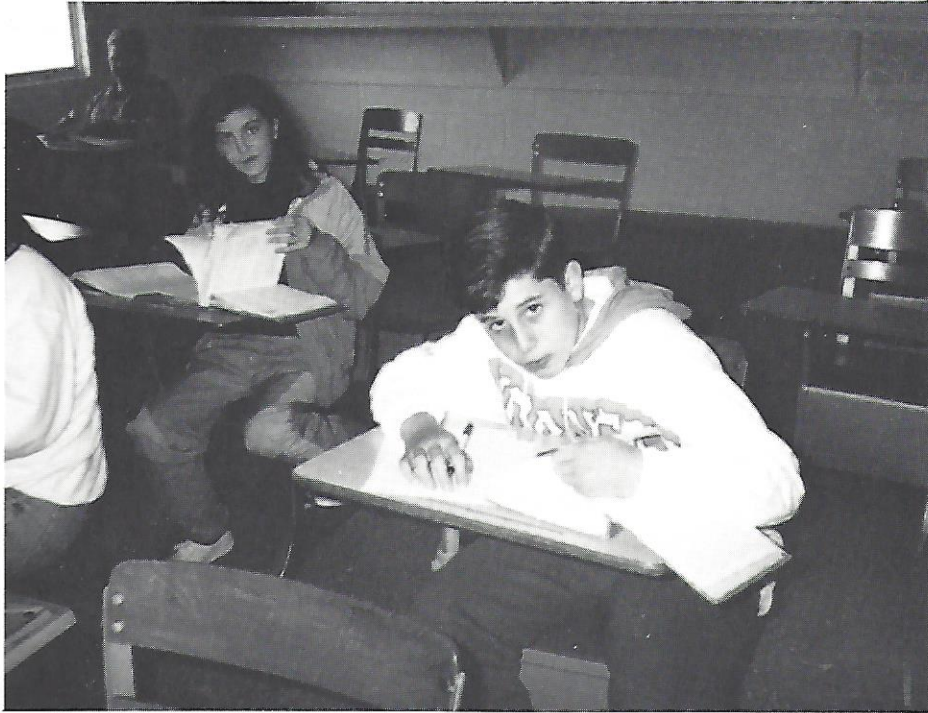

"My sister has influenced me, because she lets me know that things aren't as hard as they seem," stated Angela Thompson.

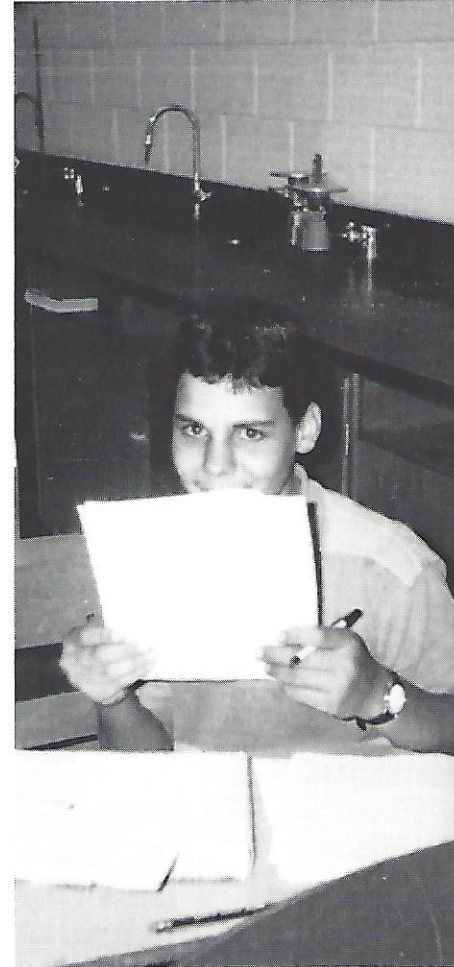

## Driver's License

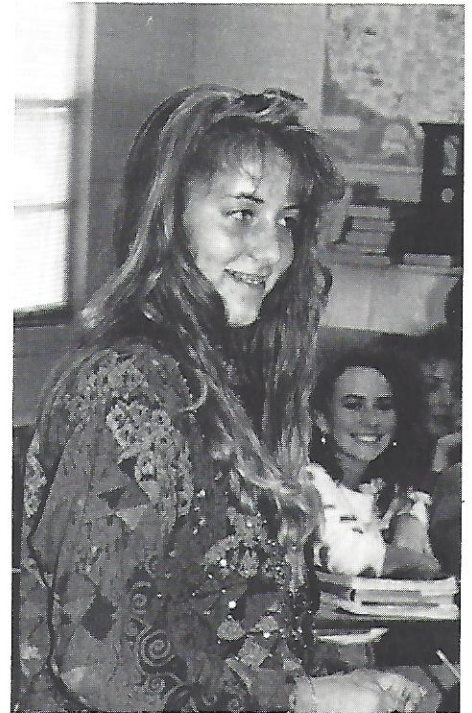

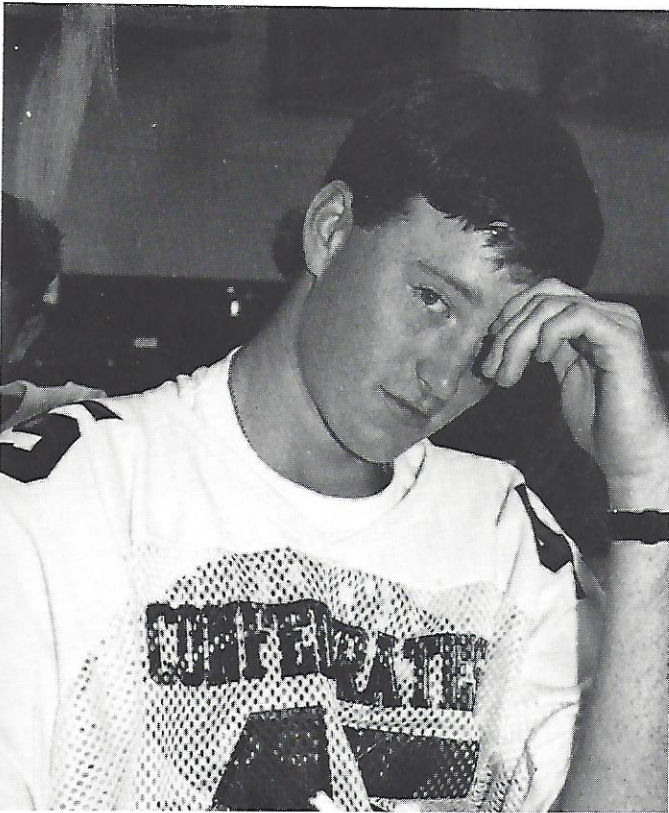
## Only One More

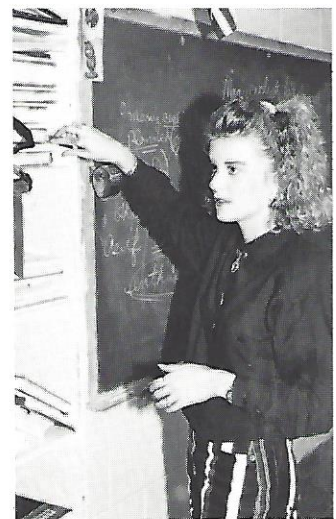
## What Lies Ahead

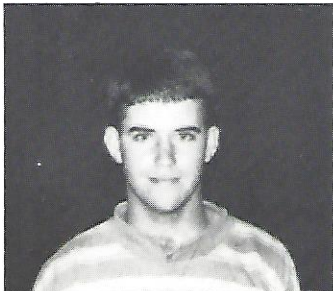
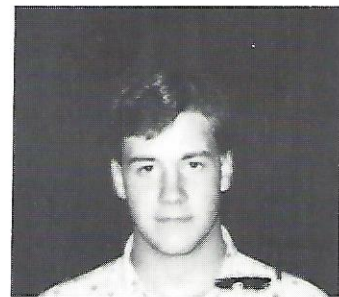
When asked how he liked to spend his weekend, Scott Lindsey said, "I like to ride the strip. I also like to go to parties."
