## FOREWORD

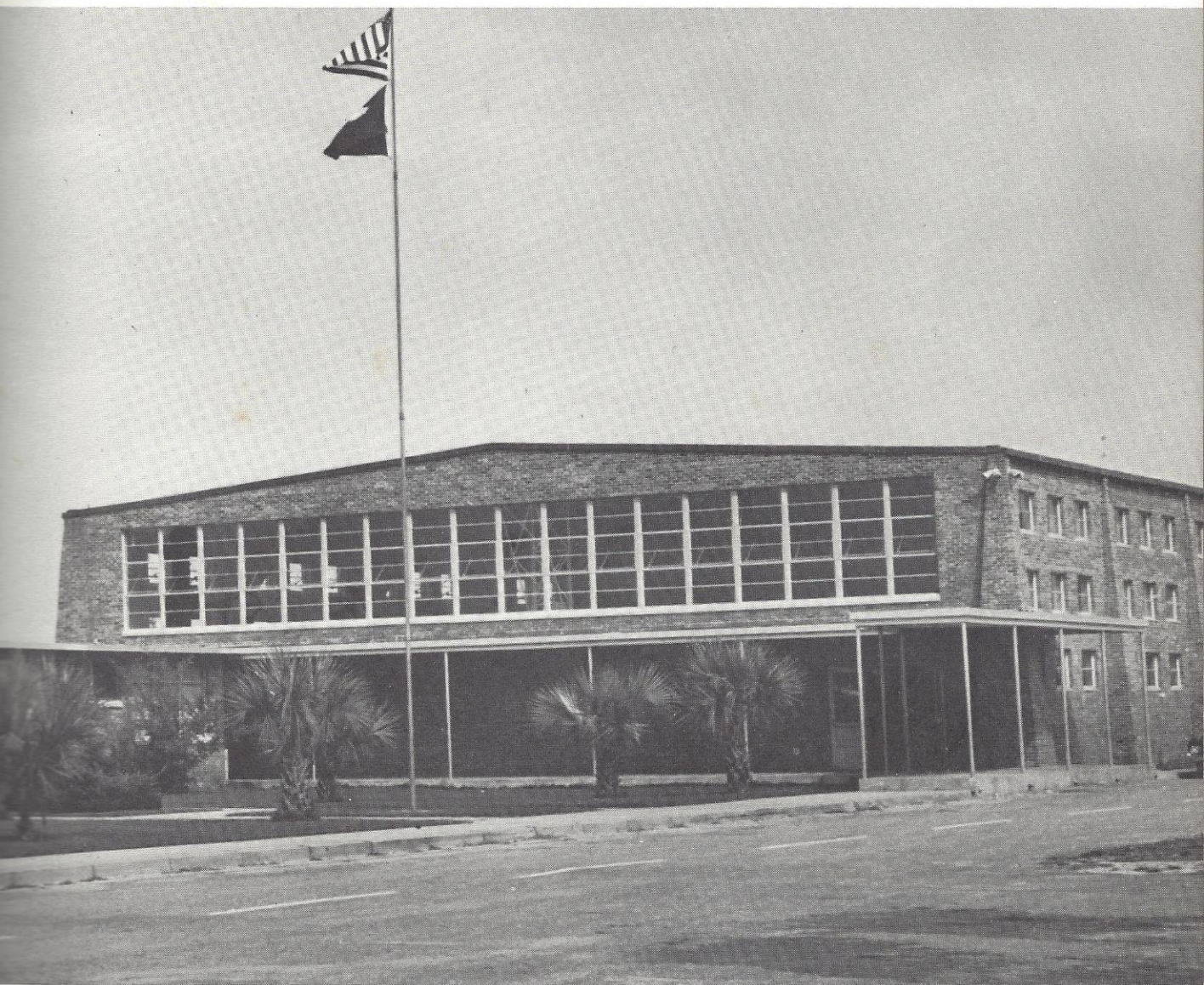

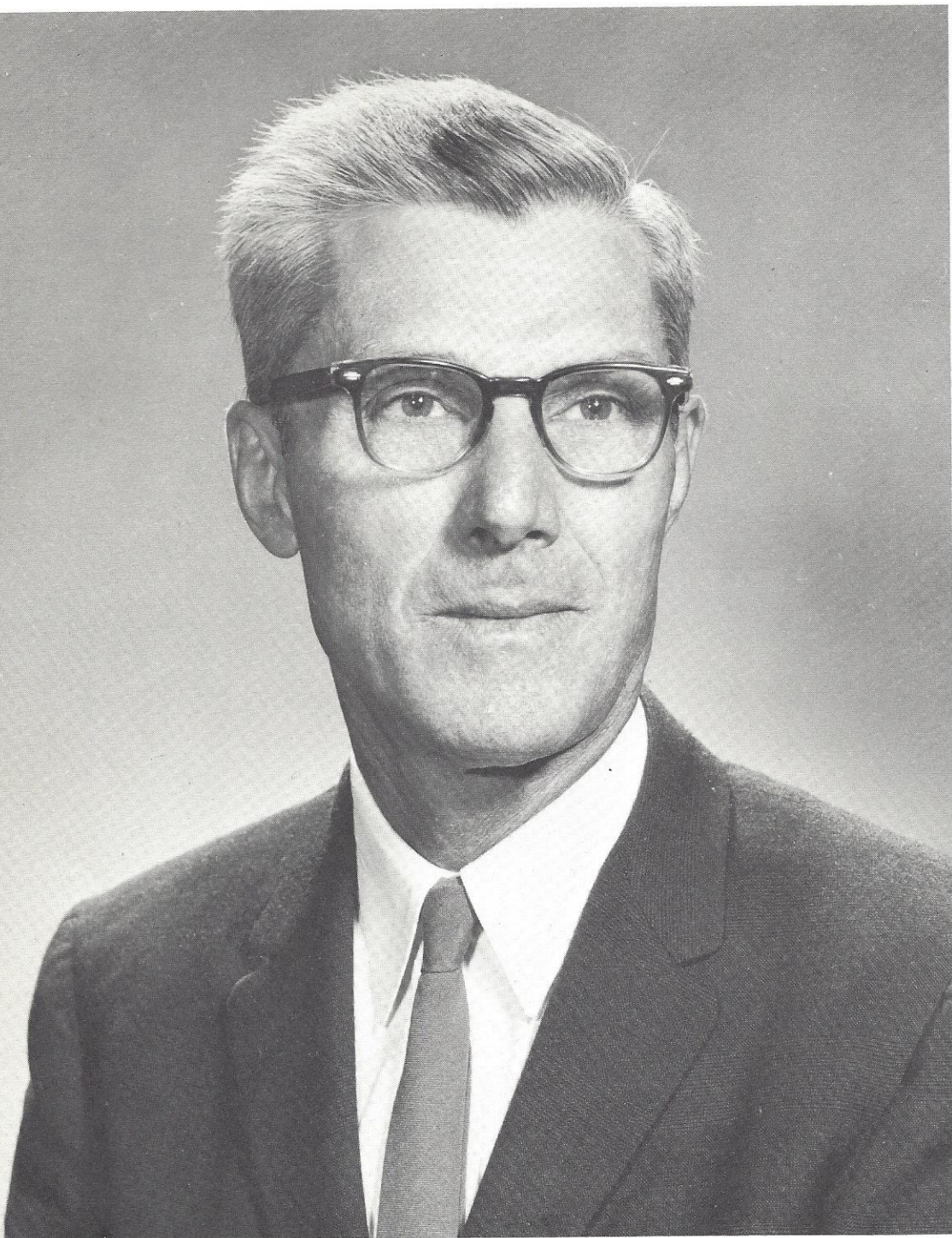


## ADMINISTRATION

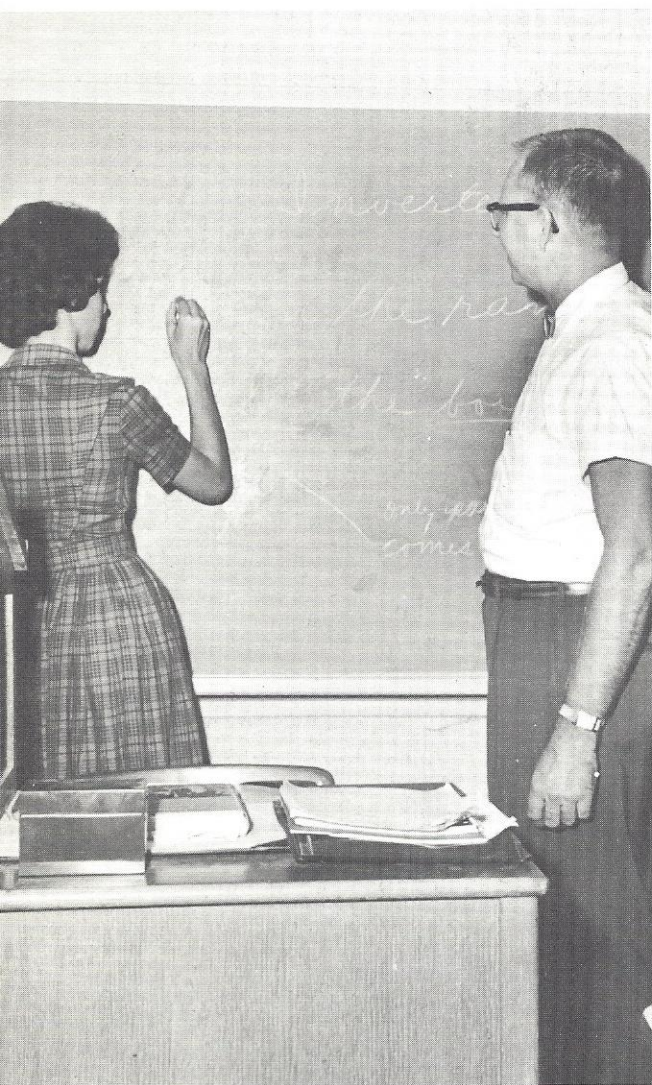

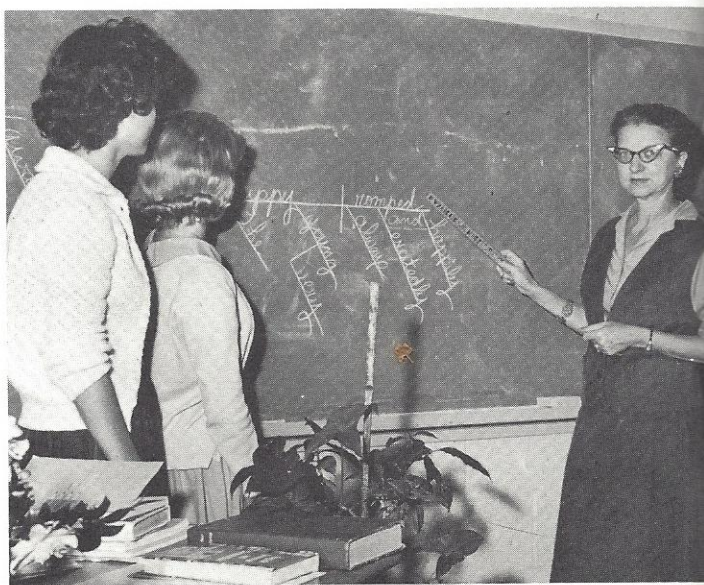


Wanda Strickland demonstrates to the class how sentence order can be changed.

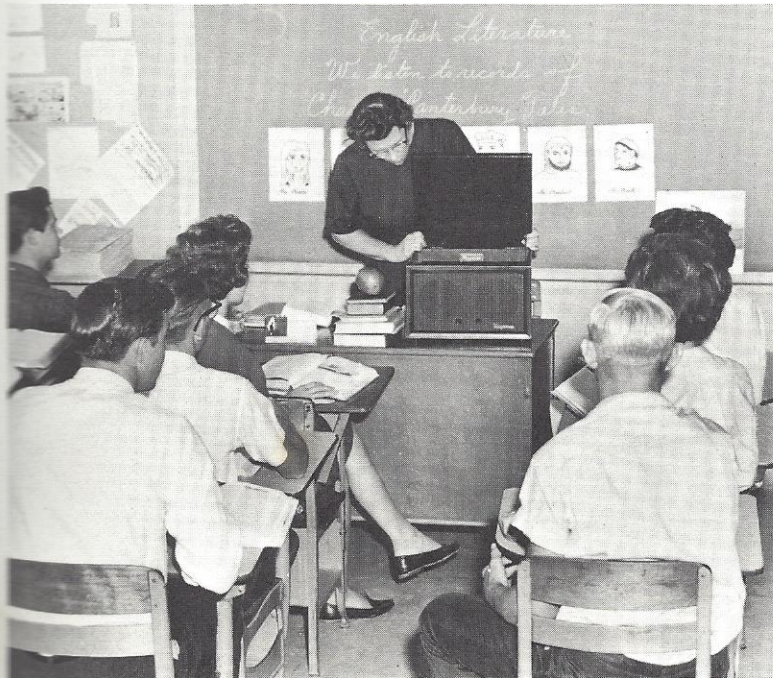

French, the only foreign language taught at Bells, is a part of the college preparatory curriculum. This year, only first-year French is offered, but first-year and second-year will be available next year.

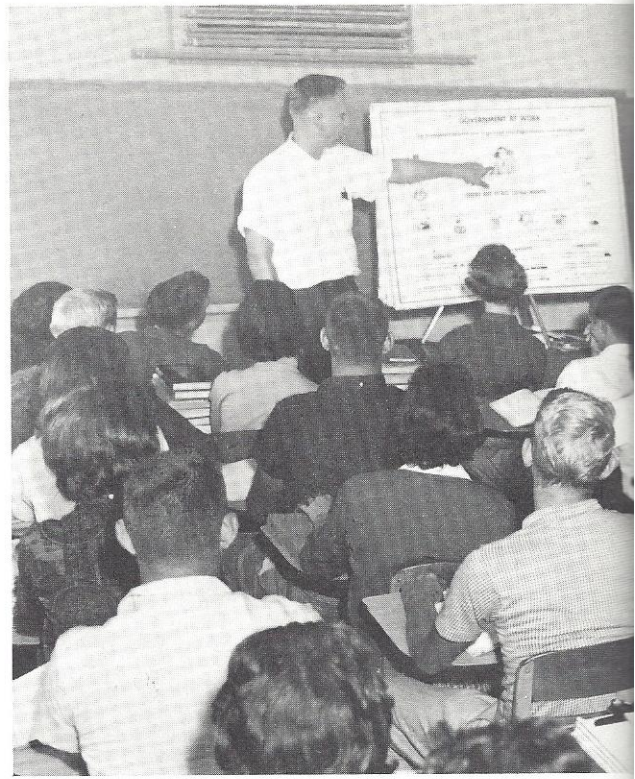

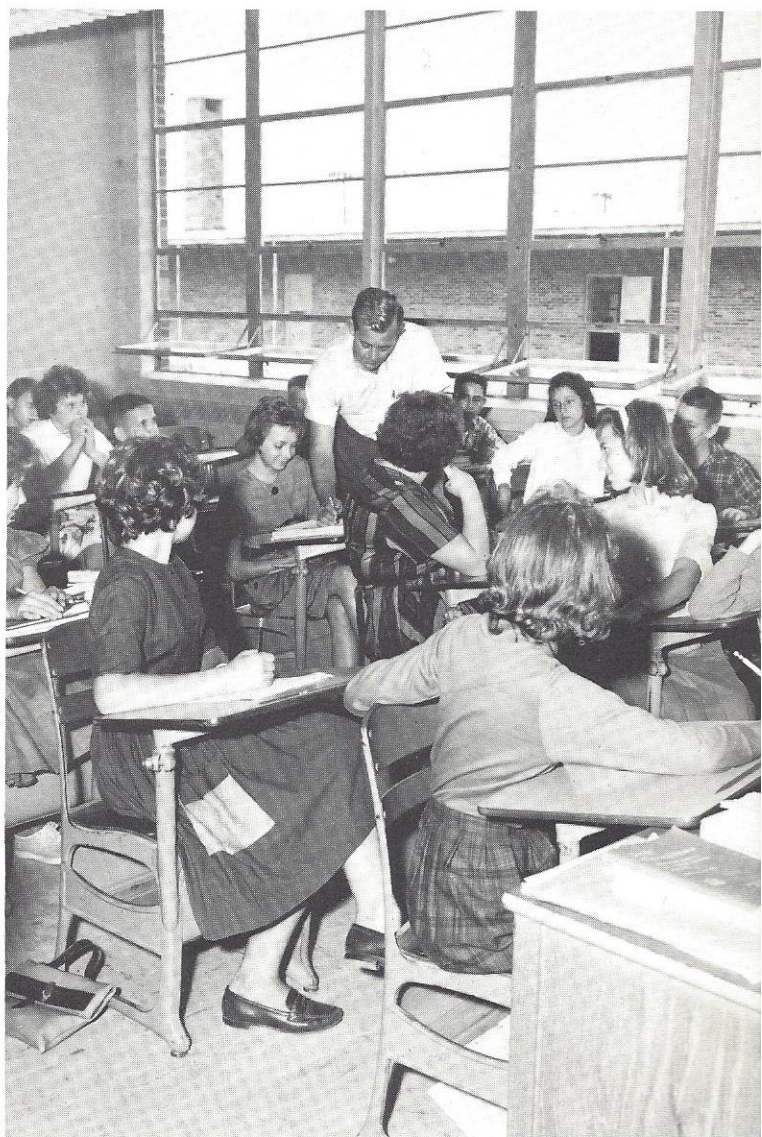

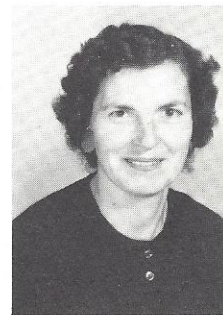




# Home Economics

The course is broad enough to be helpful to those students who will not farm but will follow an occupation within the field of agri-business. Much emphasis is placed on leadership and citizenship.

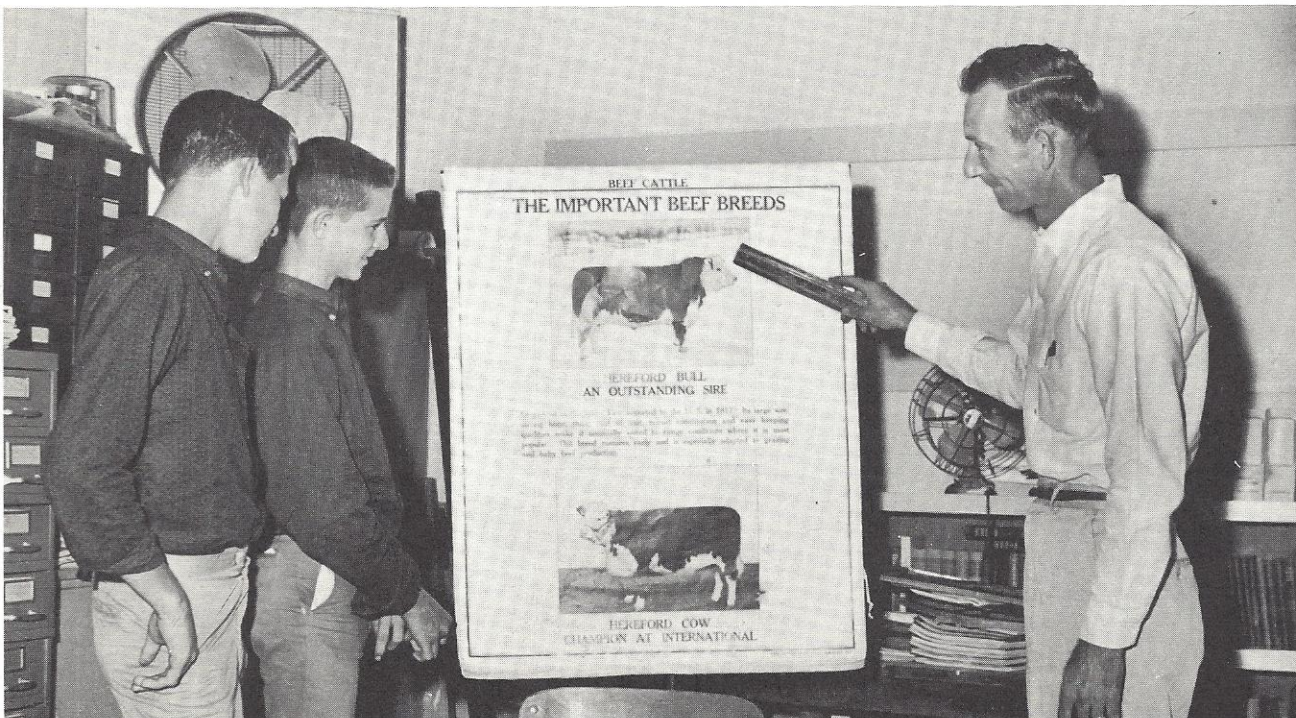

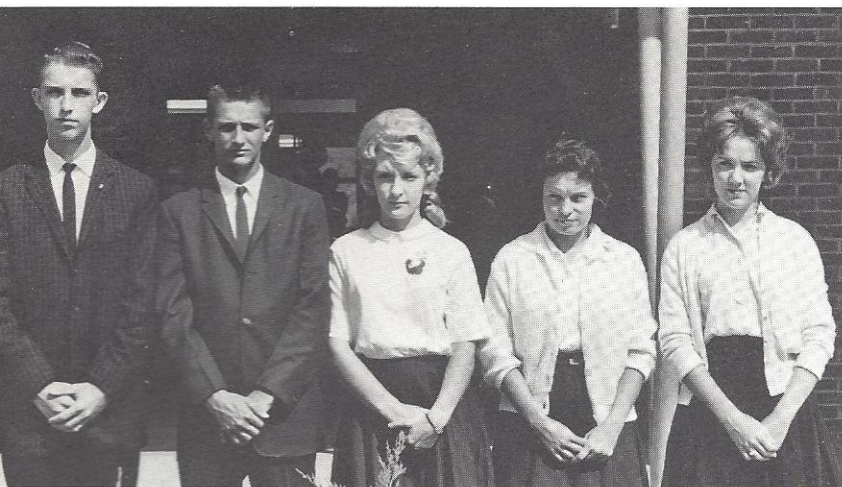
Here at Bells this council carries on elections, conducts assemblies,

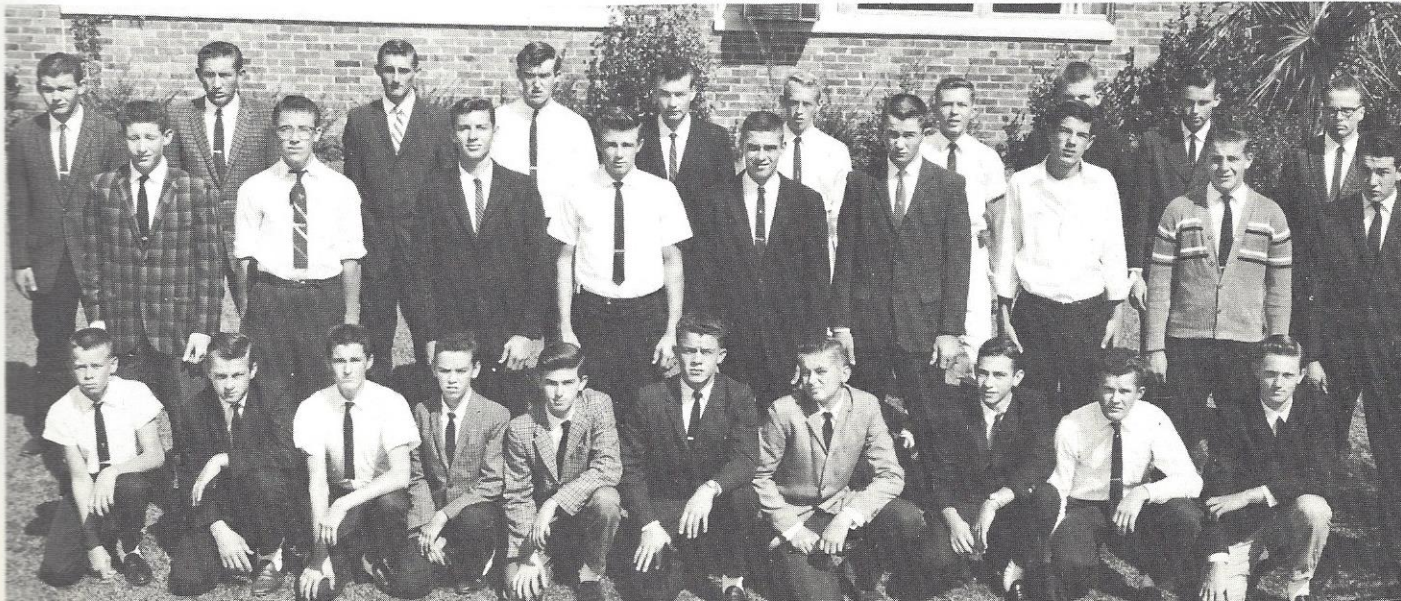
## Parliamentary Team Captures District Championship

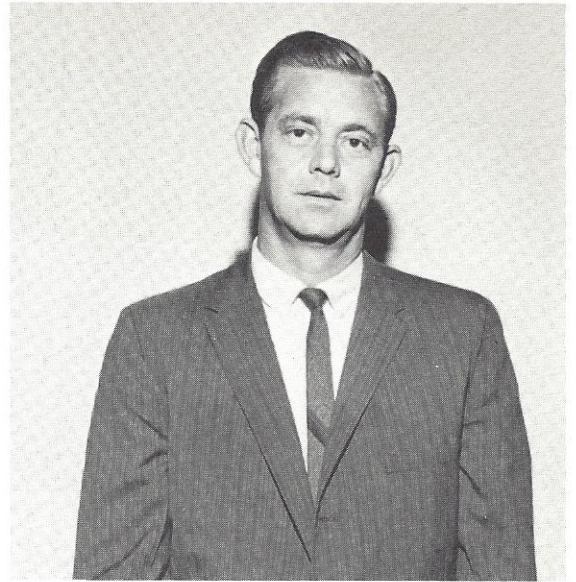
1. To develop good leadership and citizenship.
