
Curriculum








MATH -LANGUAGE OF SCIENCE


The math department is well equipped with teachers who teach Jr. High Math, Algebra I and Algebra II. Advanced Algebra and Trigonometry are taught every other year.

The Social Studies Department at Bells is very important. Through history, geography, and government courses students learn more about the world situation. They are aided in preparing for the future by studying the past and the present.






COMMERCE

Boys who take Auto Mechanics receive classroom knowledge and actual practice in the shop. This prepares them better for the future if they plan to enter into the trade.







MUSIC AND P.E.


STUDENT COUNCIL

PARTICIPATE IN FIELD TRIPS


