
There are many different parts to a yearbook: layouts, copy, pictures, writers, money, calls, sweat and blood. I would like to personally thank the following people for their time and effort.


The staff has worked many days and nights through rain, snow, ice and *Charlie's Angels*. Good or bad, I thank all who contributed.
