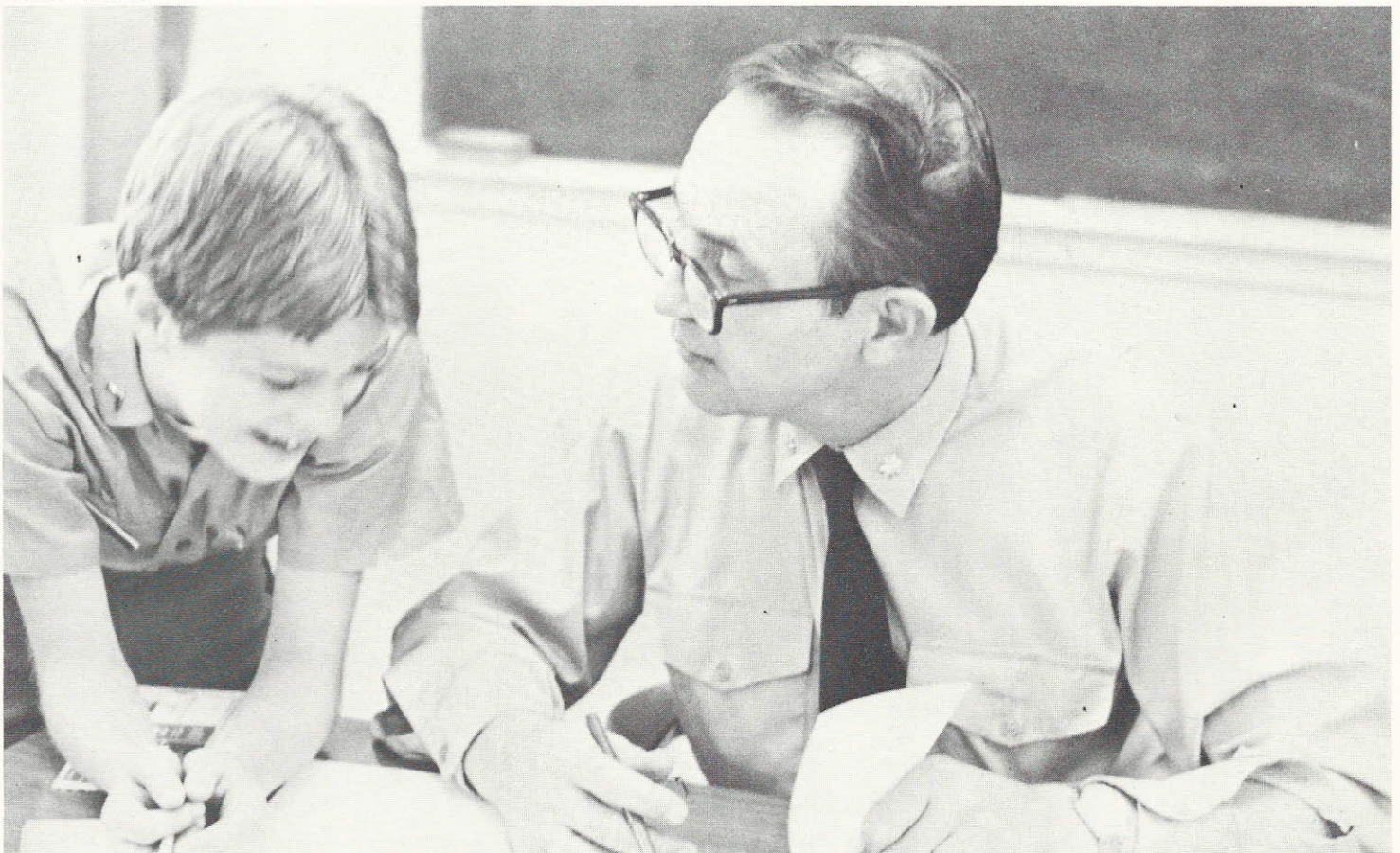
Persistence pays.

Individual attention is one of many advantages that cadets receive at CMA. Tutoring classes, scheduled each Tuesday and Thursday afternoon, enable students to catch up on missed assignments and to receive help in areas that are not mastered. Instructors are on hand in their classrooms from 12:40 until 3:10 on these days to help students in their work.

Cadets who fail one or more subjects during a two-week period must return to their classes for tutoring. Receiving individual help from dedicated instructors helps cadets pull their grades up and often stimulates a developing interest in their subjects. Motivation on the student's part and persistence on the instructor's combine to make tutorials a key factor in academic success.
