A BREED APART

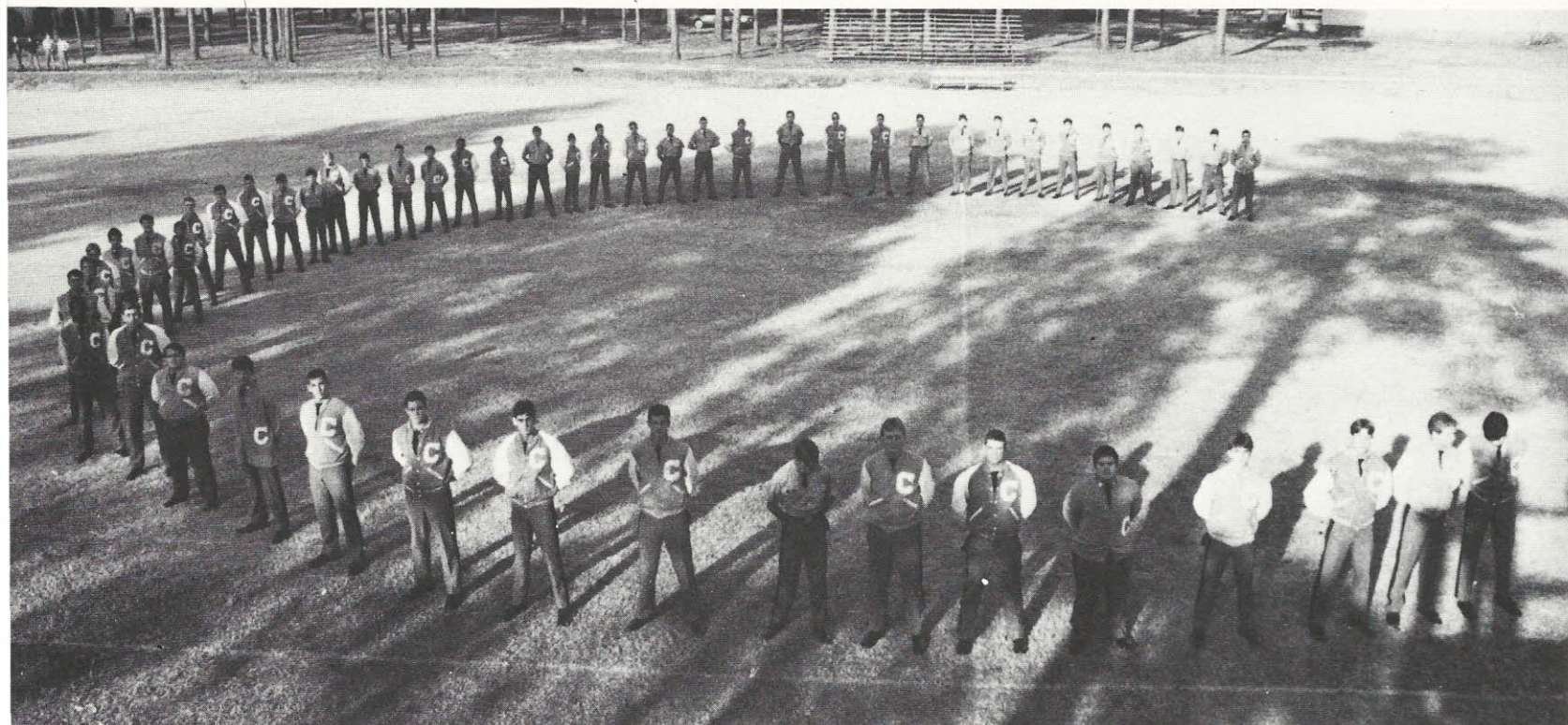
