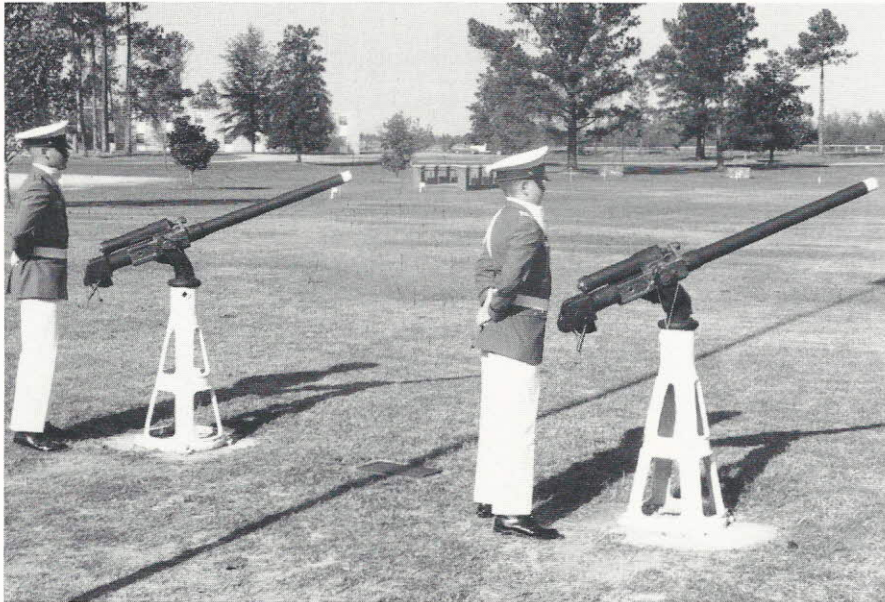


Former director of the Nat'l Park Service, George Hartzog troops the line with Btn Cmdr Osborne and B Co CO Nicholson.
