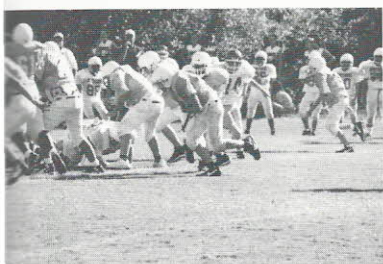

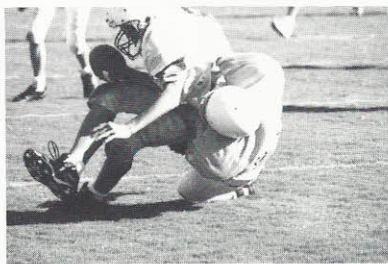

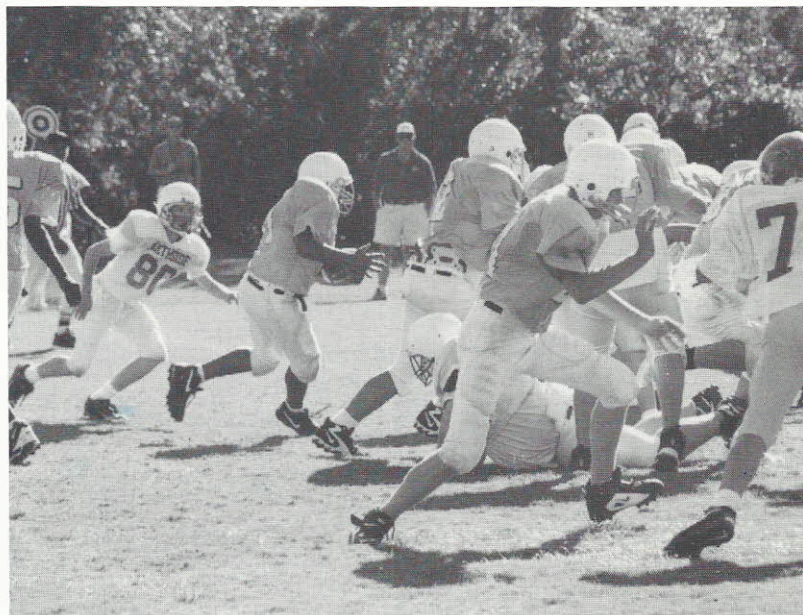

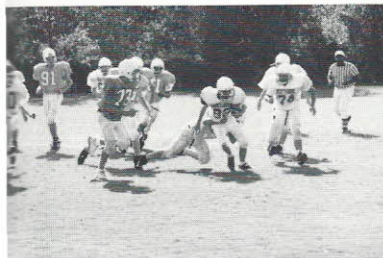
Led by Quarterback Darryl Muldrow, the Spartan offense runs the option.
