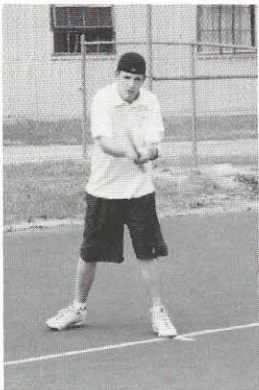

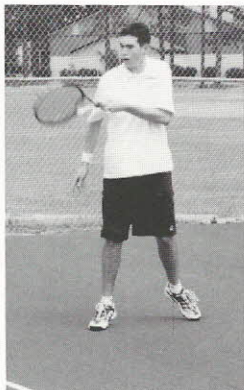

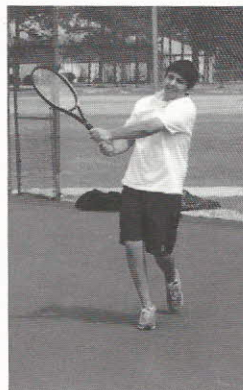
Senior MVP Aaron Chapman slaps a two-handed backhand across the net. He led the Spartans in 2001.



Coach's Award winner Gray Burch returns the ball with force.



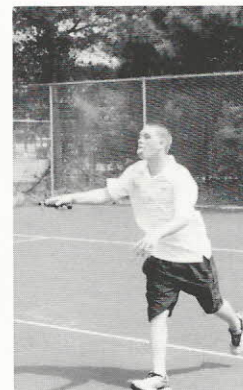
MIP Frank Aull demonstrates his effective forehand.



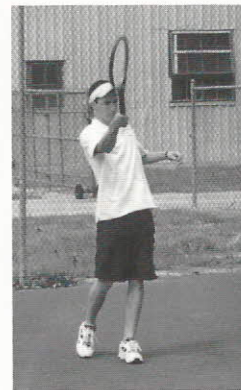
Senior Rivers Killen slices a backhand into his opponent's corner.
