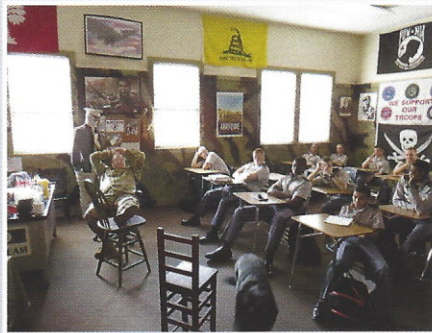
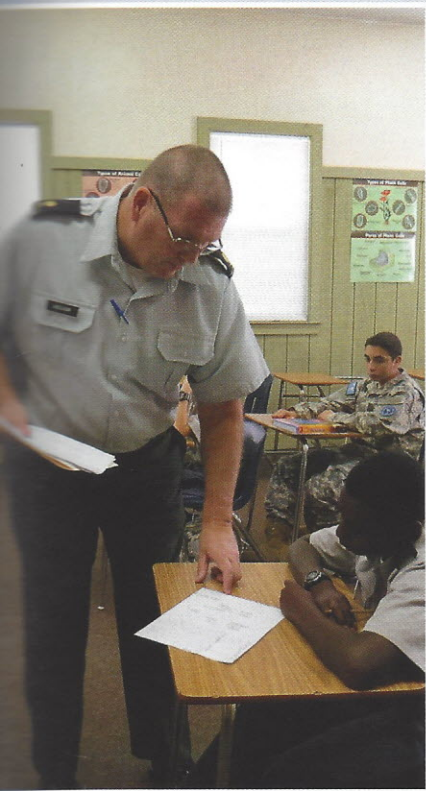
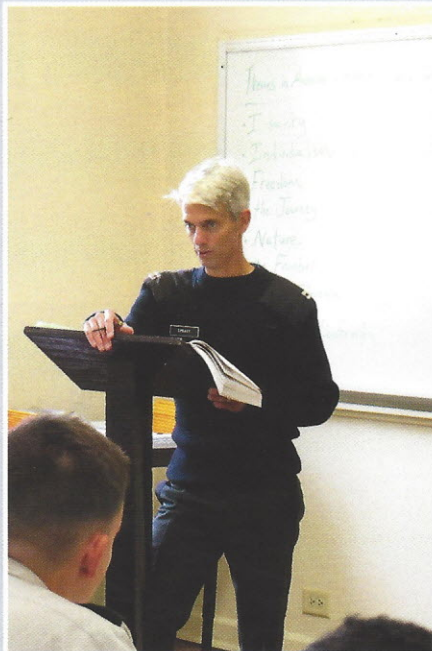


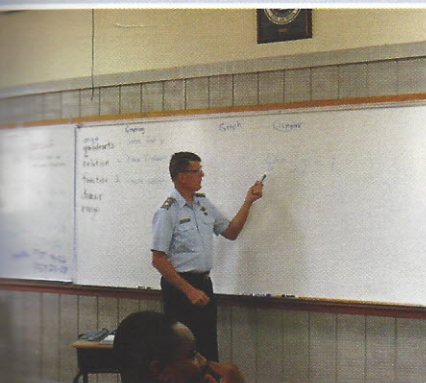
# TEACHER faces



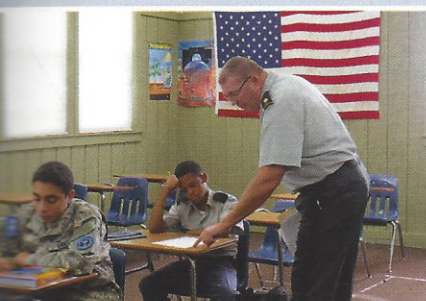

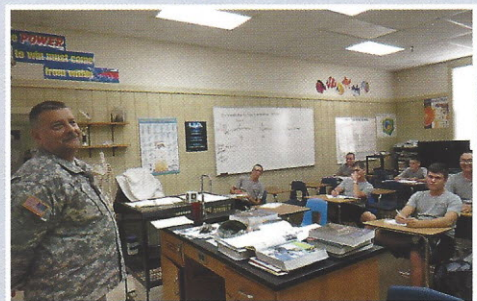
