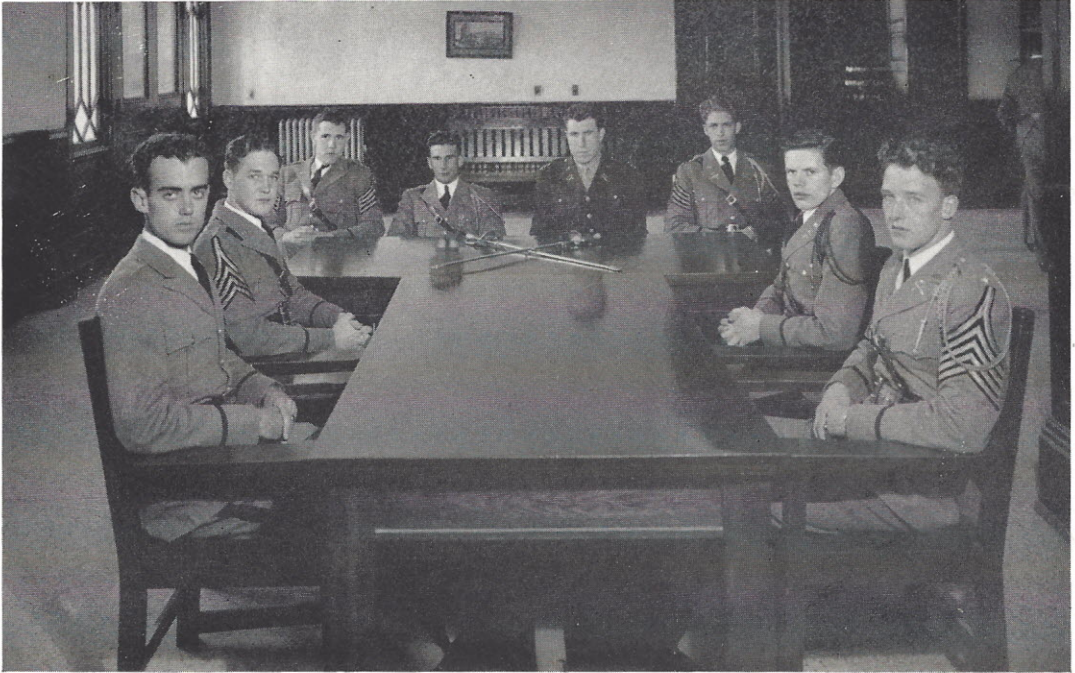


HONOR COUNCIL



THE HONOR COUNCIL has been a great tradition at Carlisle for many years. It is composed of seven cadets selected from the student body with a faculty adviser. This group is on the order of a jury. It awards punishment to the cadet or cadets for violations of rules which reflect discredit on the honor of the Corps of Cadets.

This Honor Council meets in secrecy with no one except the members and a faculty adviser. It calls in witnesses and questions them when necessary. After the evidence has been weighed, the members of the council decide upon the verdict of guilty or not guilty by means of a vote. After the verdict has been decided, the Honor Council decides on what punishment shall be awarded. The verdict, along with the recommended punishment, is then submitted to the Commandant of Cadets and the Headmaster for approval. When this is approved, the punishment is announced through a special order.

It is a great honor, as well as a great responsibility to be a member of the Honor Council. The cadets chosen to receive this honor are elected by the Corps of Cadets on recommendation of the faculty. The members of the council are, for the most part, commissioned officers.
