Youths lend a hand in their communities

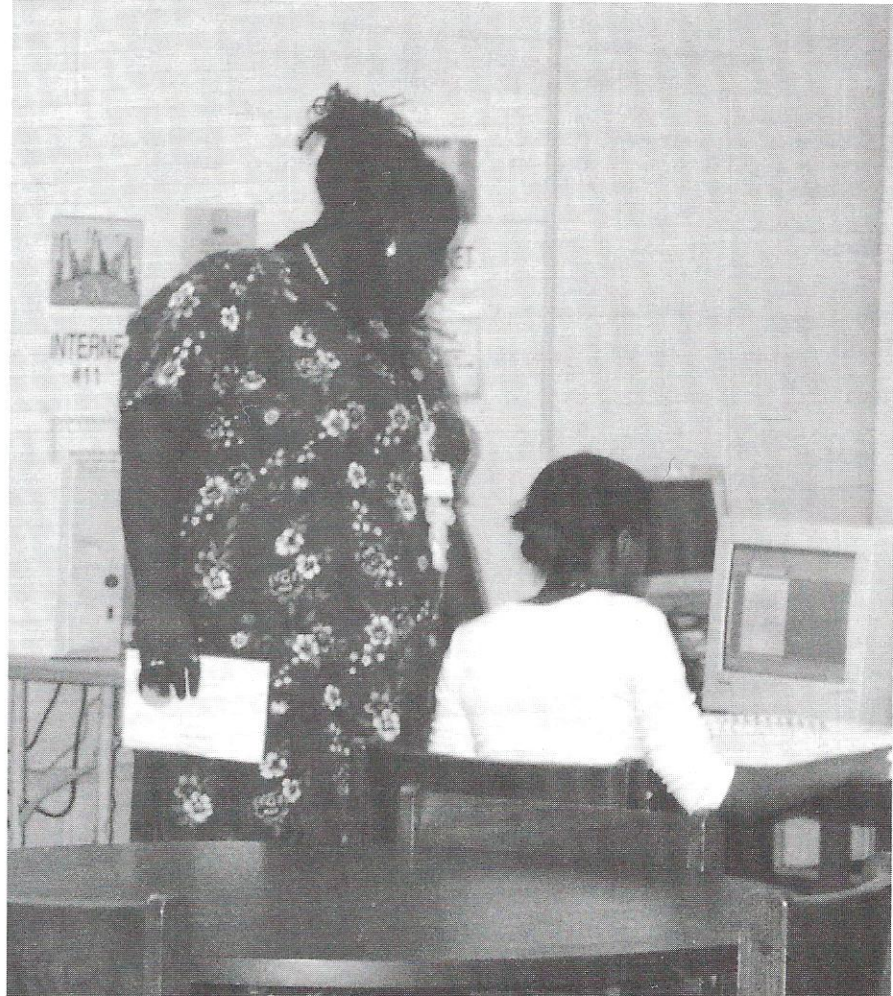
