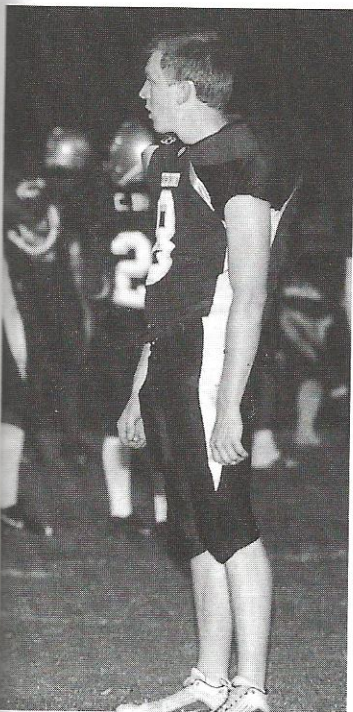
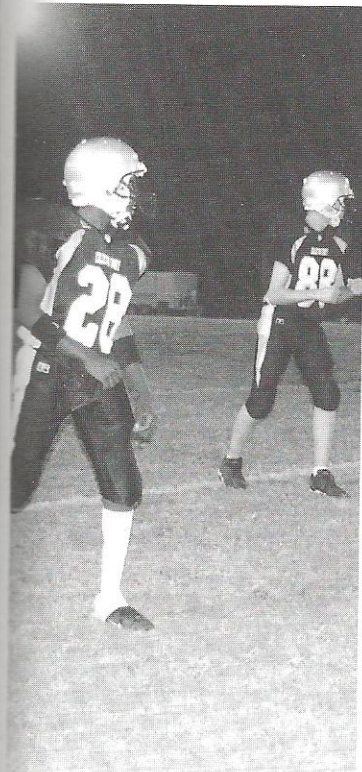

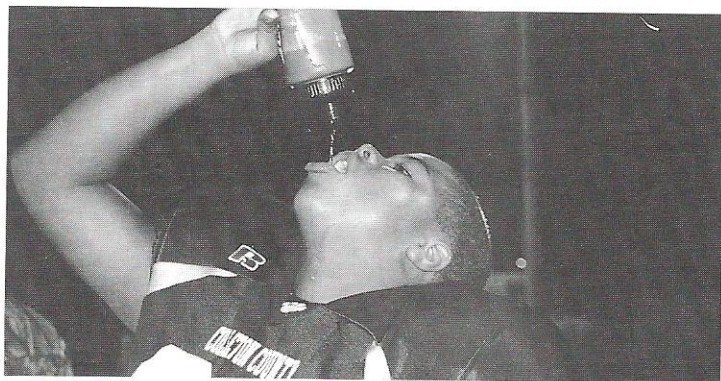
seventy.

With the hard work, both mentally and physically, came priveledges such as their names being placed on the back of their jerseys. They recieved their names because they had attended a certain amount of summer work outs.

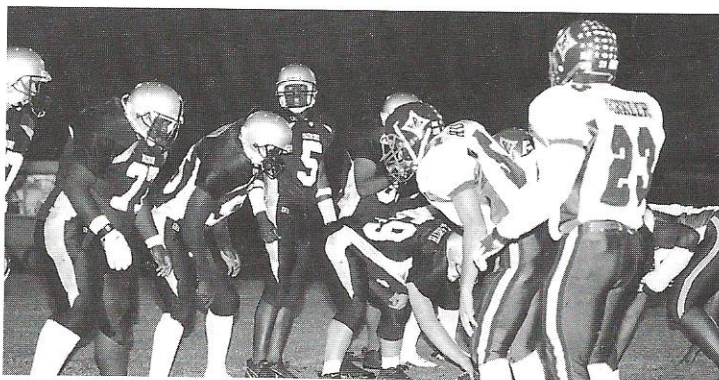
The football players used
