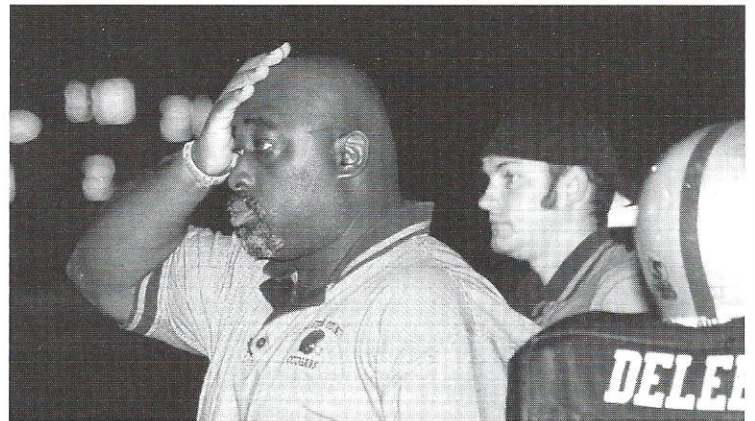
Senior Cougars Roar

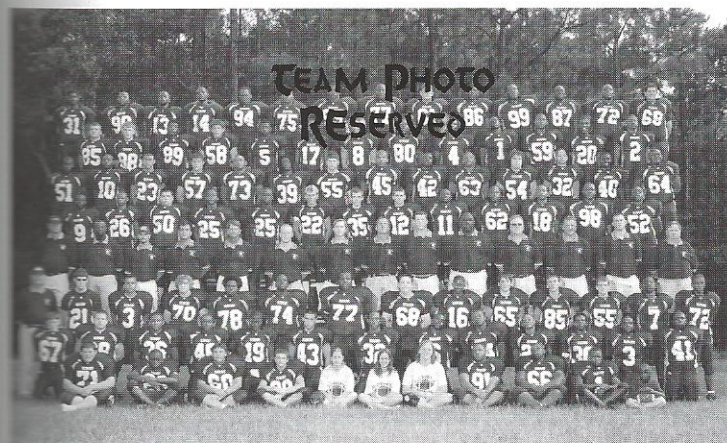
