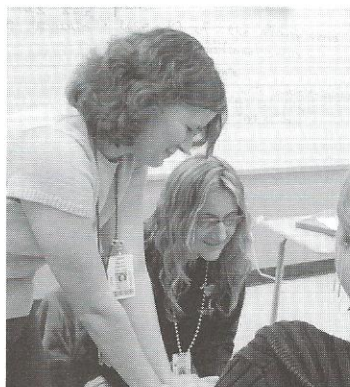


"I headed up a program called PACE. It was an alternative certification program that offers individuals who are not education majors in Undergraduate School the opportunity to participate in the field of teaching."
