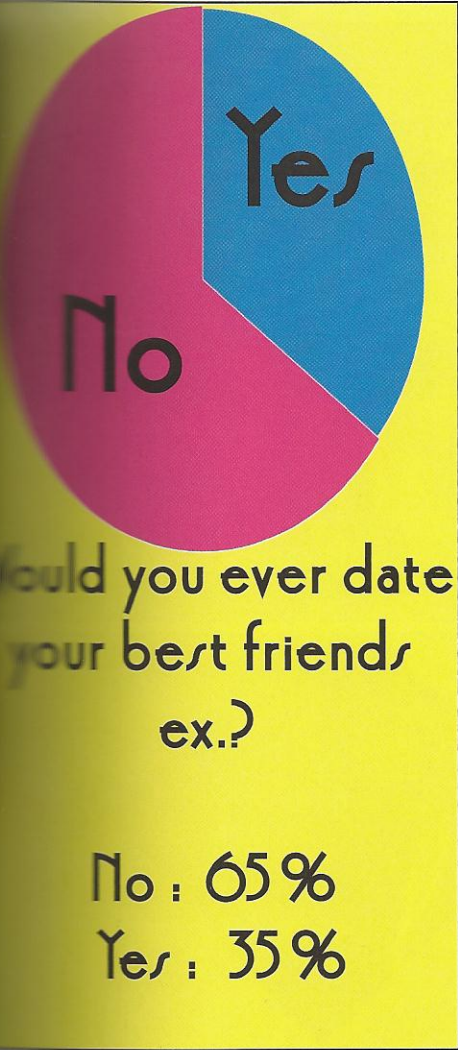
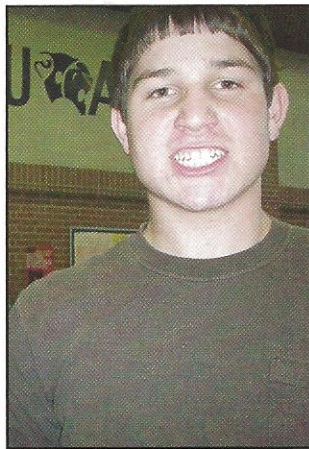
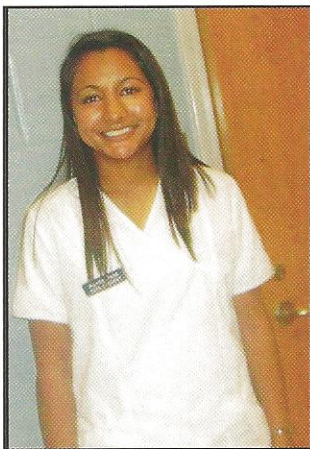


# Fantastic Friends
