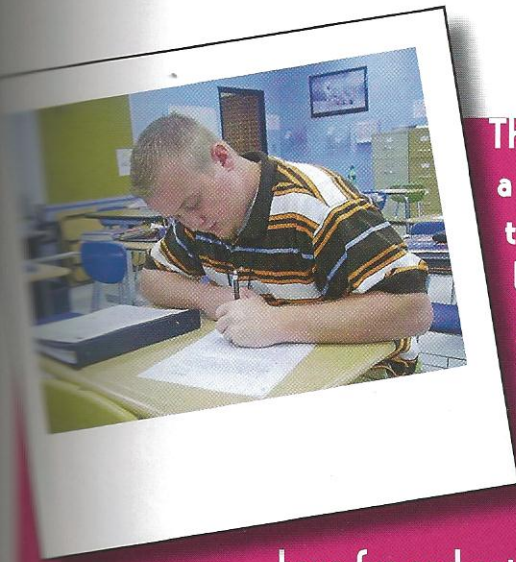


What The Future Holds
