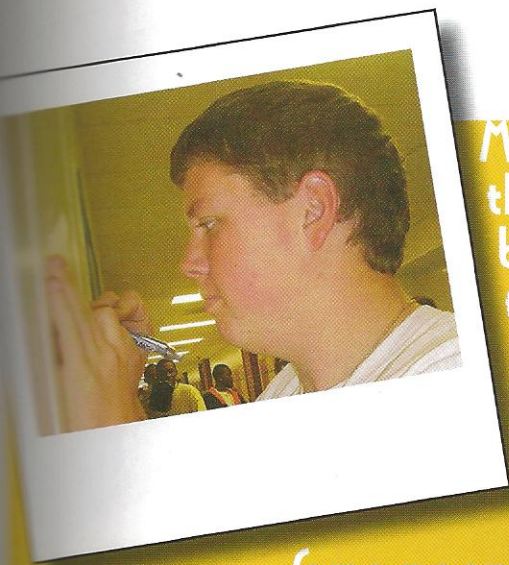


What's with the digits? Math



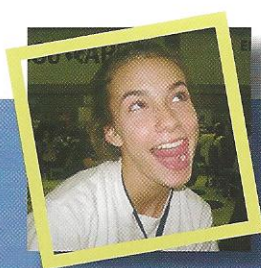

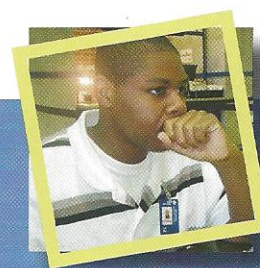
"I like math because in the future it will help me with my career in becoming a pharmacist," sophomore Monica Simmons said.
