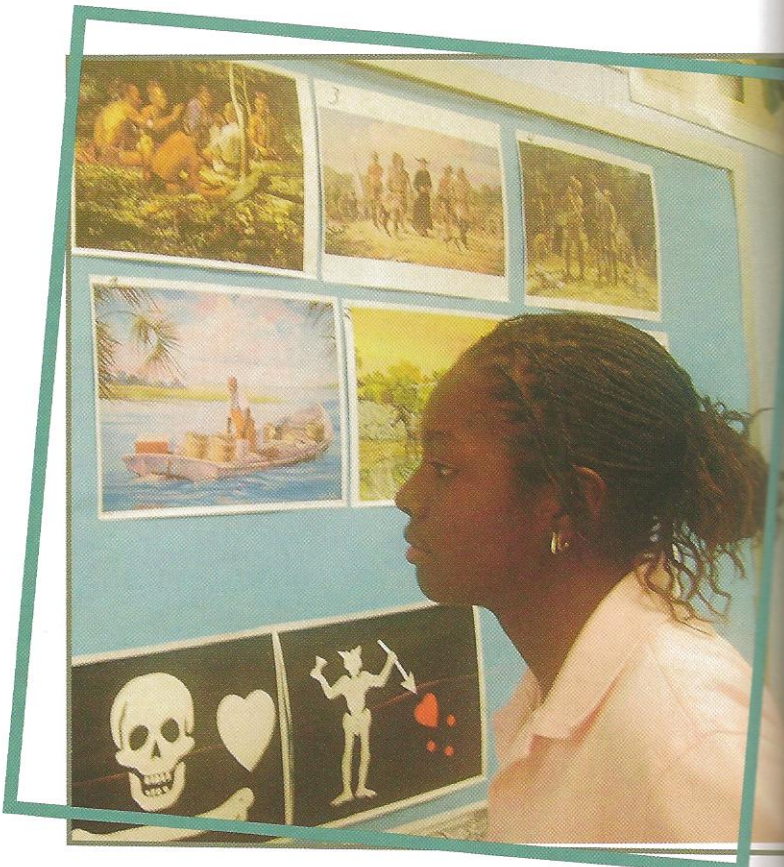


4. Malik Squire was studying the R.I.P. sign. "I think history is easy because it's stuff that's already happened," senior Malik said.
