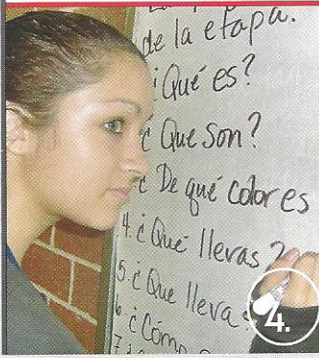


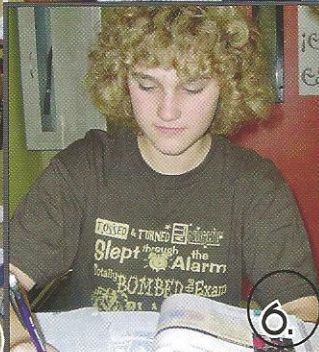
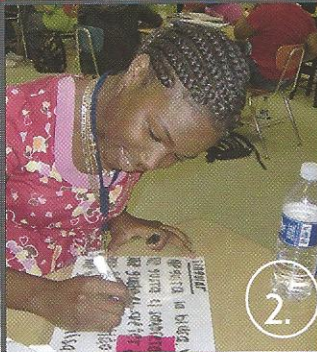
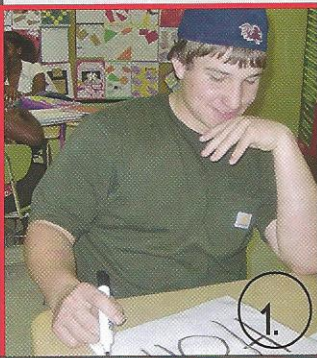
1. Sophomore Kyle Murdaugh wrote the wrong answers to Mrs. Davis' review questions. "I wanna learn Chinese," Kyle said.

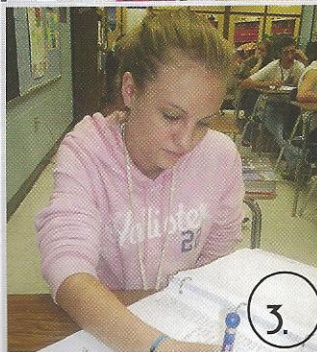
