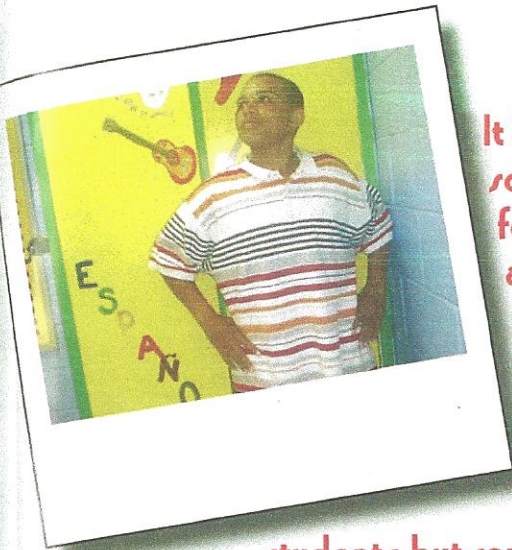


Whats up? ¿Qué arriba? Qu'en haut ?
