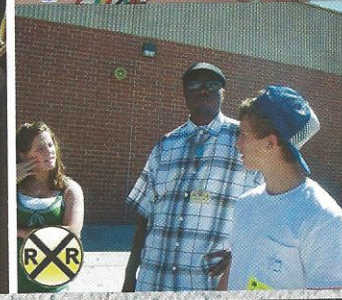
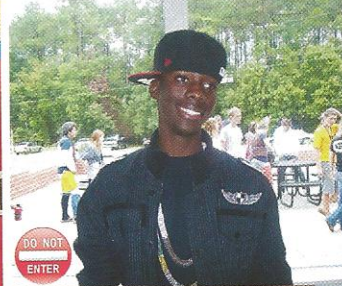

Tom rested his eyes as the bell started to ring to get to class. "If I could make my own rule I would give nap breaks in between classes," junior Thomas Howie said.



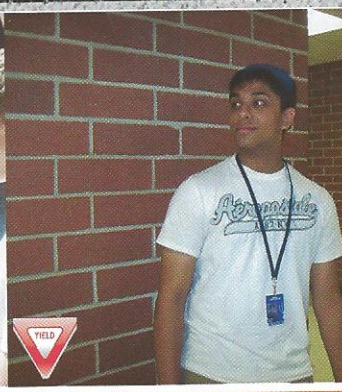
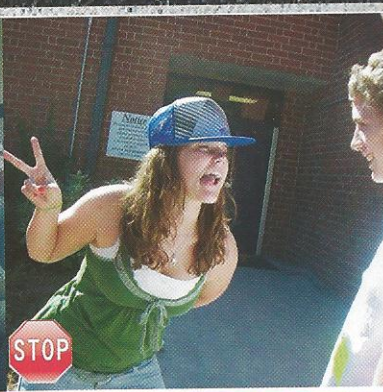
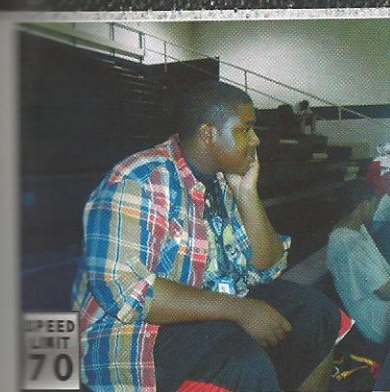
