

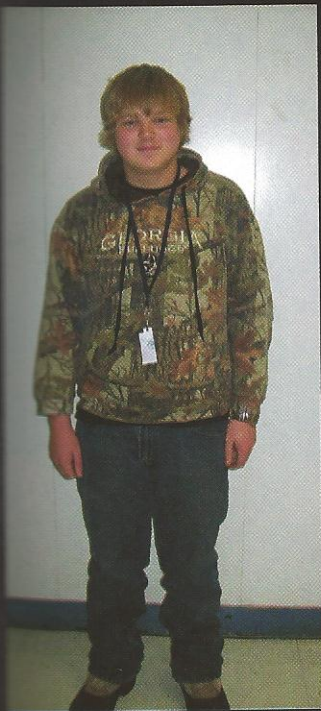
Take Careers To Class



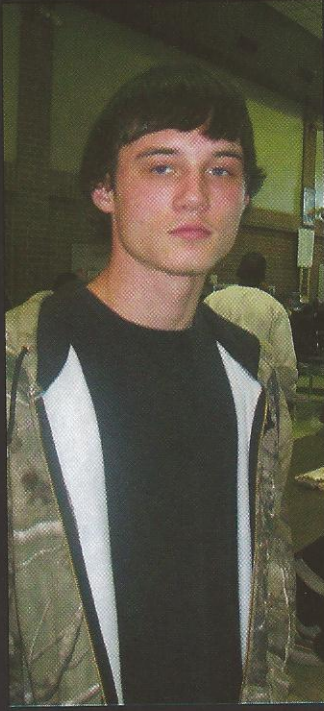

helps students achieve in life and most of the classes prepare you for your future, and help you get a jump start on learning about what you need to know for your future career.



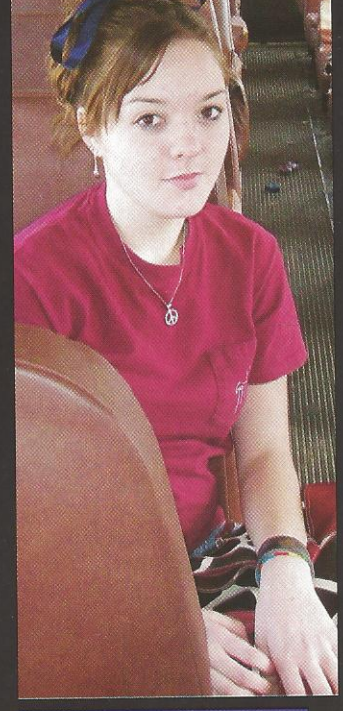
