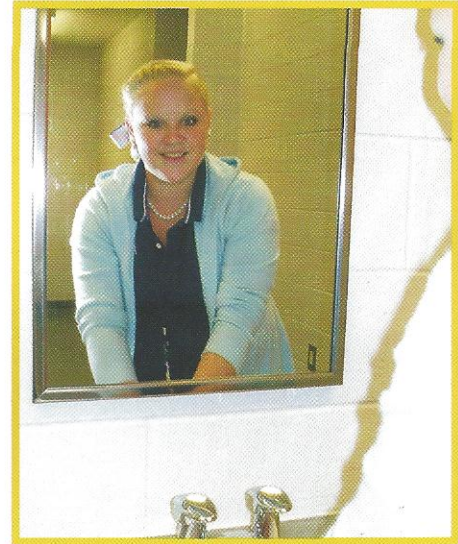
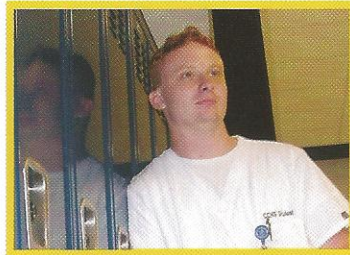
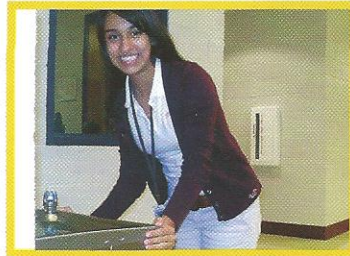


SHHS

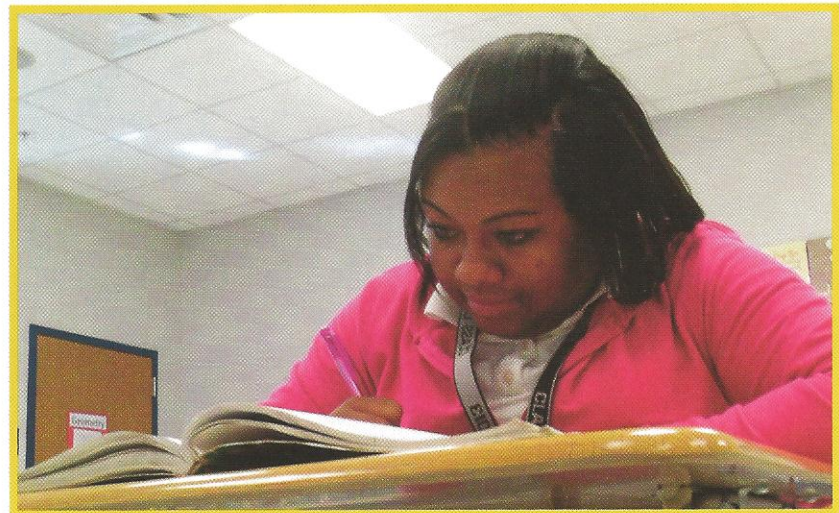
