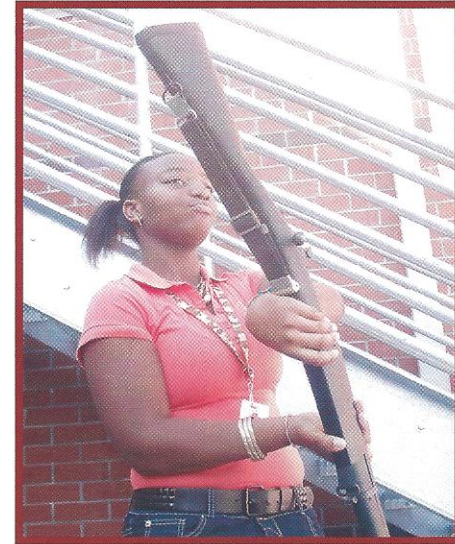
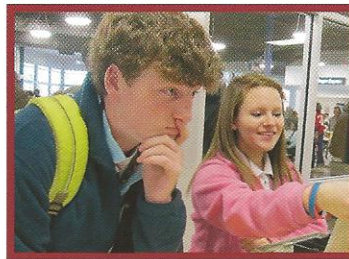
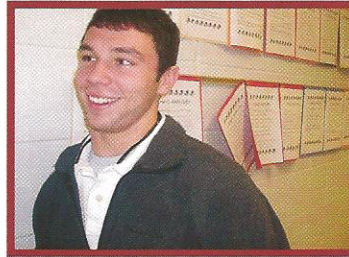


# LEAPS

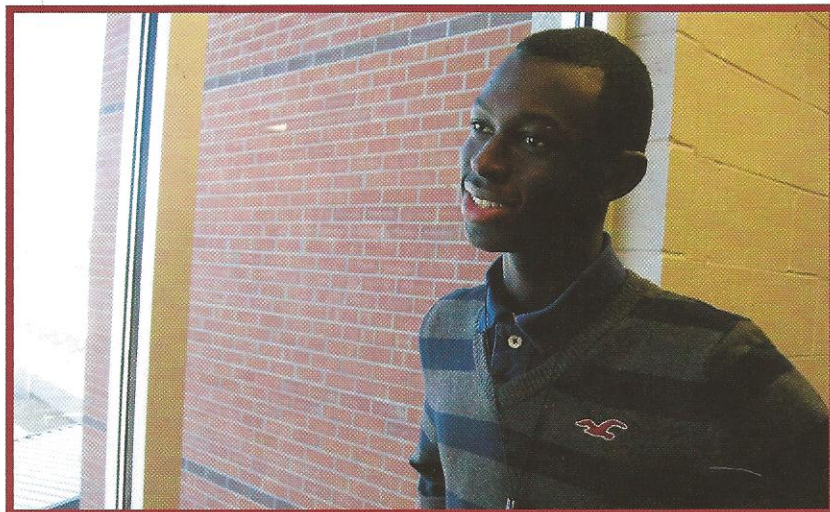
