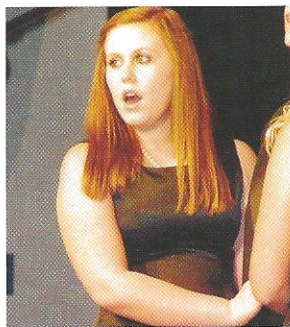
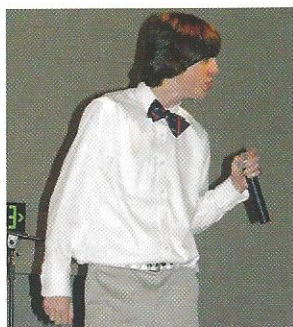


euphonious [yoo-foh-nee-uhs]
