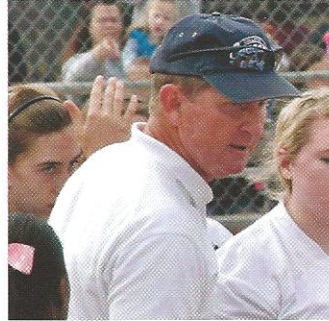

Varsity Softball

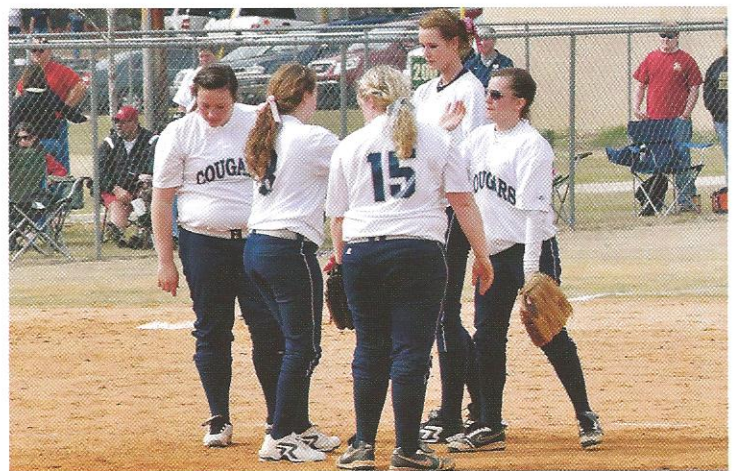
