



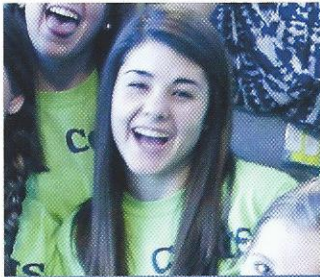

WHAT HAS STUDENT COUNCIL DONE FOR YOU?

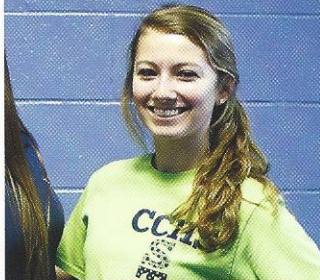
"I like Student Council because it's a good way to meet new people and help others. It's a great way to be involved in school."

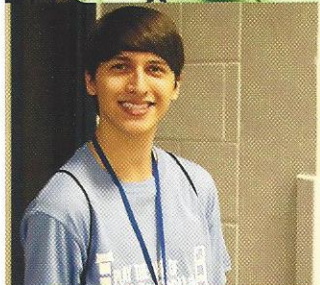

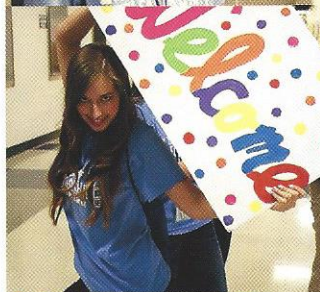
