With these tips, the players improve each and every time.

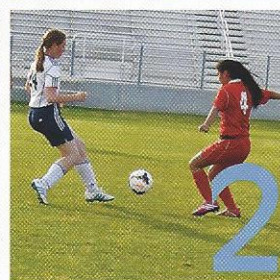
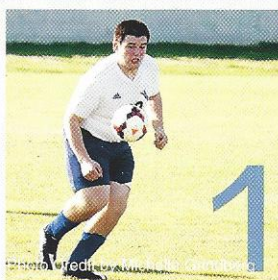
Before the game, the junior varsity girls soccer team has a quick talk with their coach about what to look forward to seeing during the game and what they need to work on. This helps them to prepare for games.
