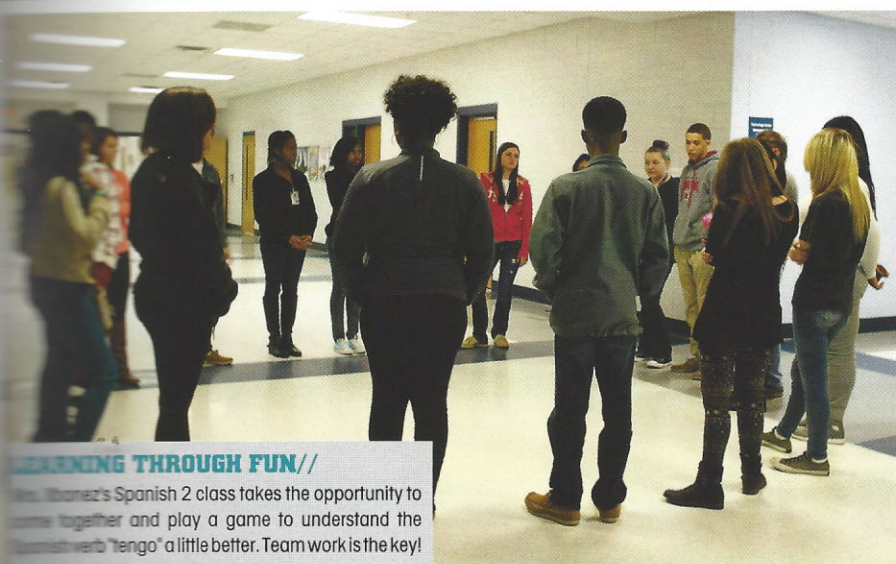
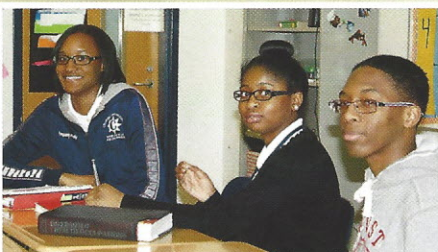
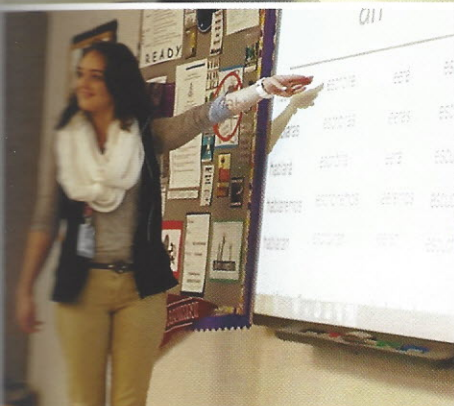


SPANISH

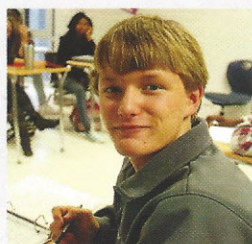
