

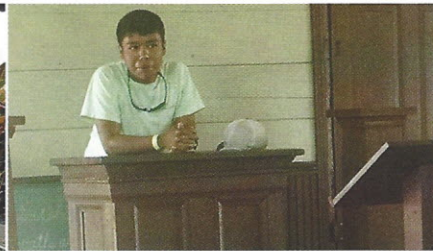


FFA
