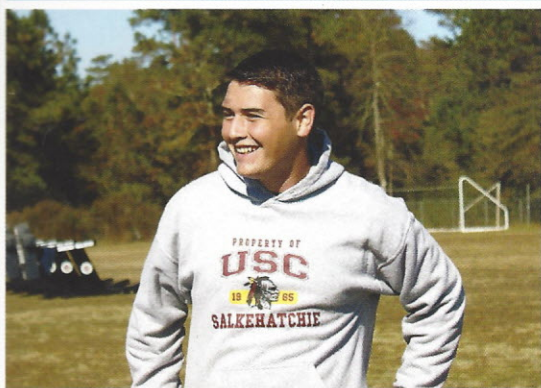


COUGAR NEW TECH

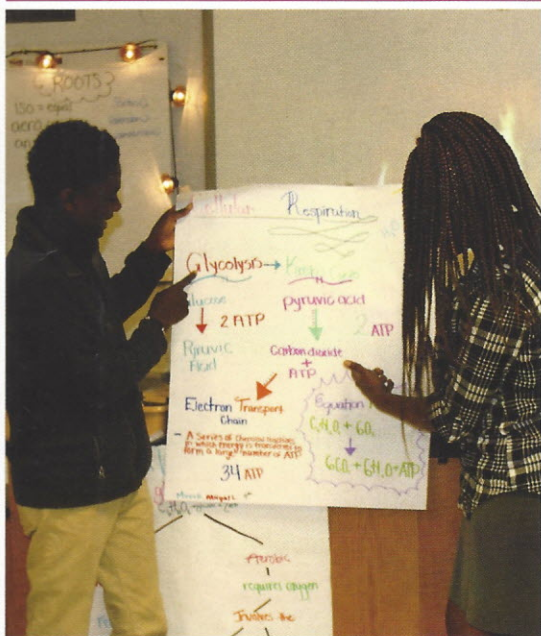
Cougar New Tech is the first New Tech school in South Carolina's Lowcountry. CNT is a project-based learning concept where students solve real world problems by applying learned content. Achievement levels are based on five criteria: knowledge and thinking, worth 50% of the grade; written communication, worth 15%; oral communication, worth 15%; agency, worth 10%; and collaboration, worth 10%. In addition, CNT students are required to demonstrate the three guiding pillars: **Trust**, **Respect**, and **Responsibility**. These are the three keys that Cougar New Tech celebrates every year--both daily and with scheduled events such as Trust Day, quarterly Family Time, and EXPO. CNT is strives to be one big family, in which we all enjoy each others presence, struggles to greatness, and accomplishments.
