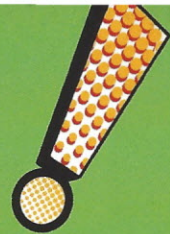


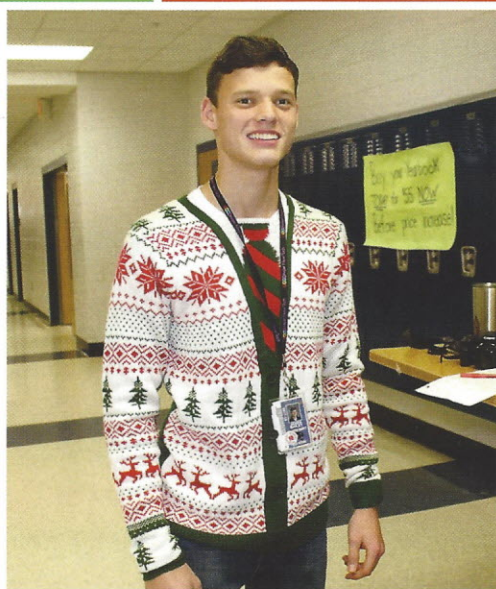
# YOUTH LEADERSHIP

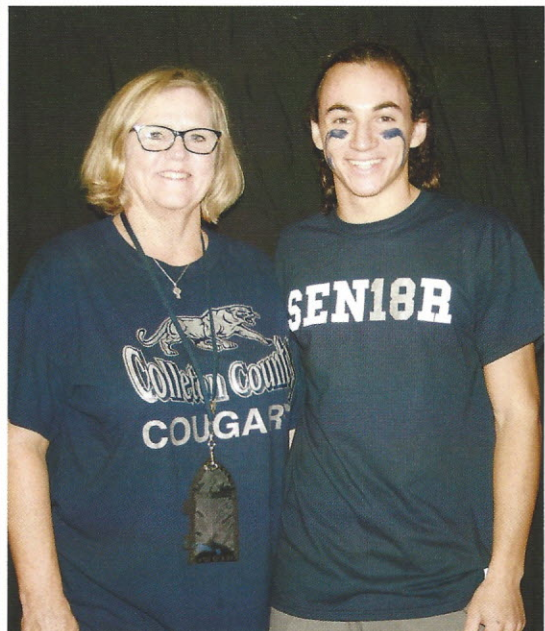


Mrs. Goodwin's first semester Youth Leadership class takes a break from working on their next project to smile for a photo. The class consists of all grade levels during both semesters.

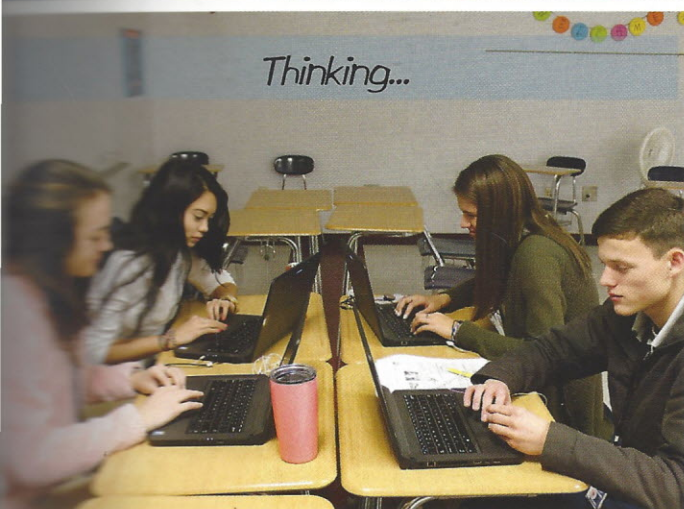


Sophomores Kaylee Pak and Heather Dowd are selling Candy Grams to raise money towards Student Council.
