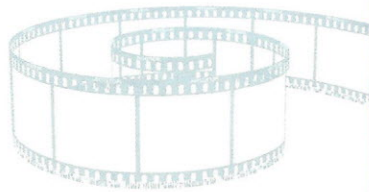


Y.I.G.
