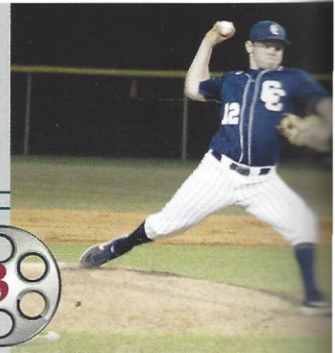

WATCH OUT

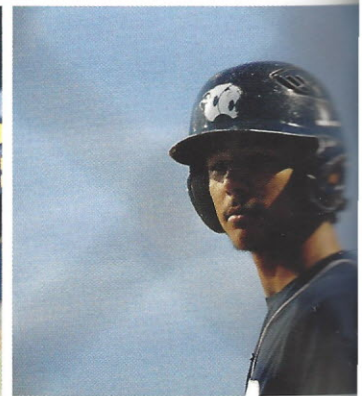
Senior Lane Lee (#12) pitches with all his heart and loves the sport that he has been playing forever.
