Friendship Strengthens Varsity

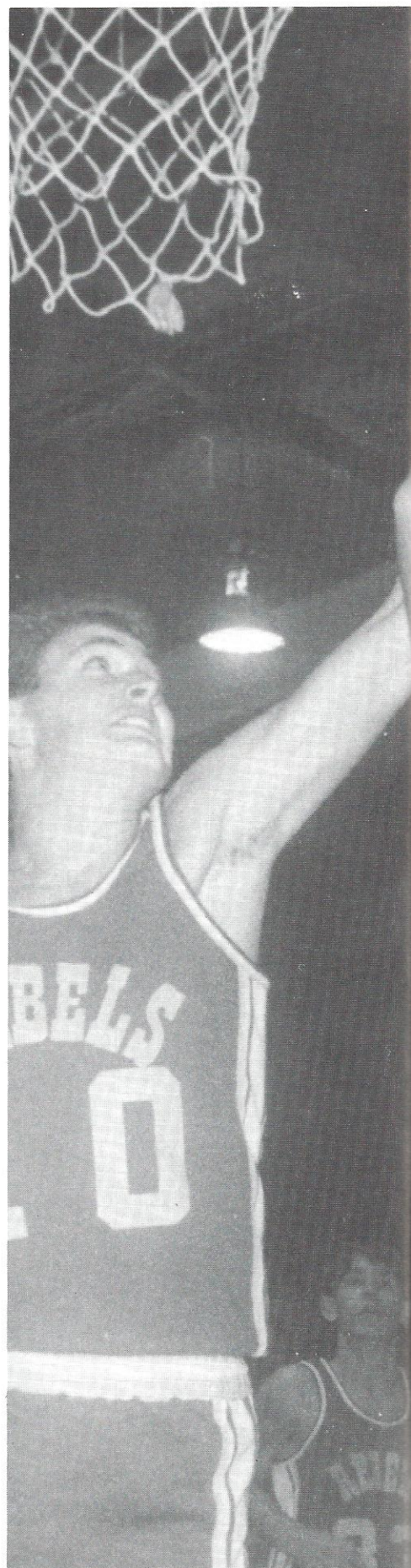
