“Accreditation means not only that the school is meeting standards, but also that we are committed to improving the quality of our programs. **Mr. Quarles**”

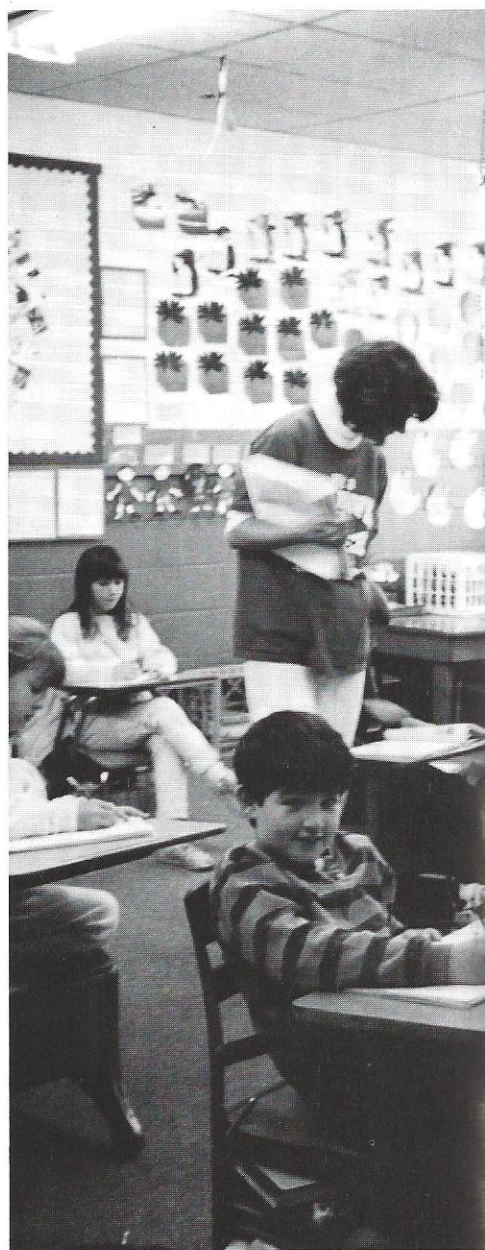
In November, the hard work that the faculty, students, and parents put into Colleton Prep was once again recognized. The school was awarded the level of advanced accreditation from the S.C. Independent School Association. Of the members of SCISA, only about 10 percent achieve this level.

A team of teachers, headmasters, and college professors evaluated the school in all areas, in-

cluding teachers, facilities, administrative policies and student achievement. For two days, the evaluation team observed classes, toured the facilities and even ate food from the school's lunch room. They then met with the student council. The team found that CPA had excellent programs, an innovative curriculum, a strong athletic program, and respect between students and teachers.
