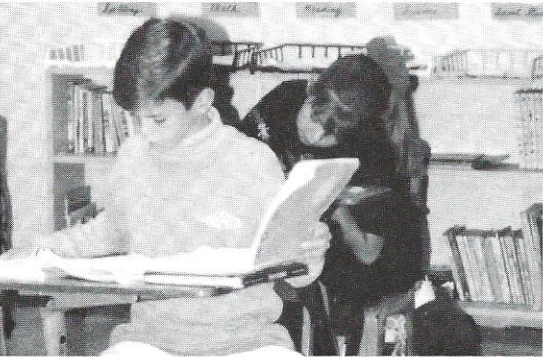


4th Grade

The fourth graders, dressed as Christmas presents, practice singing. The class sang carols at a P.T.O. meeting.



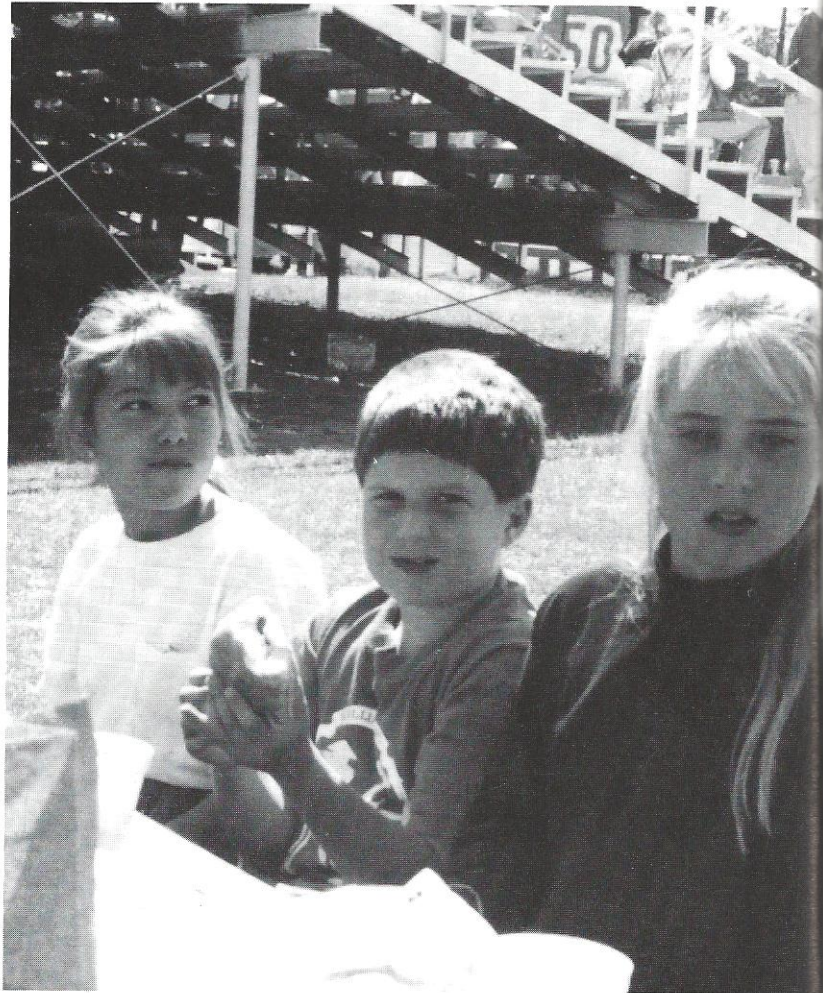
John Roddy Ackerman and Beth Steedley work on science questions during class in Mrs. Fischer's room.
