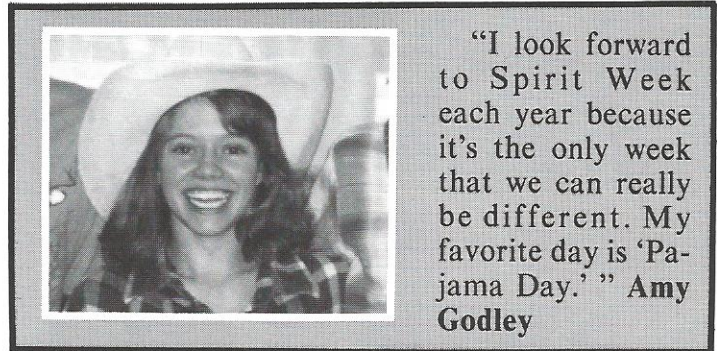


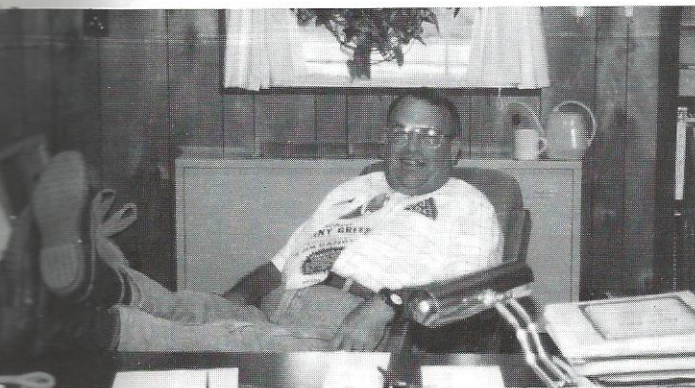

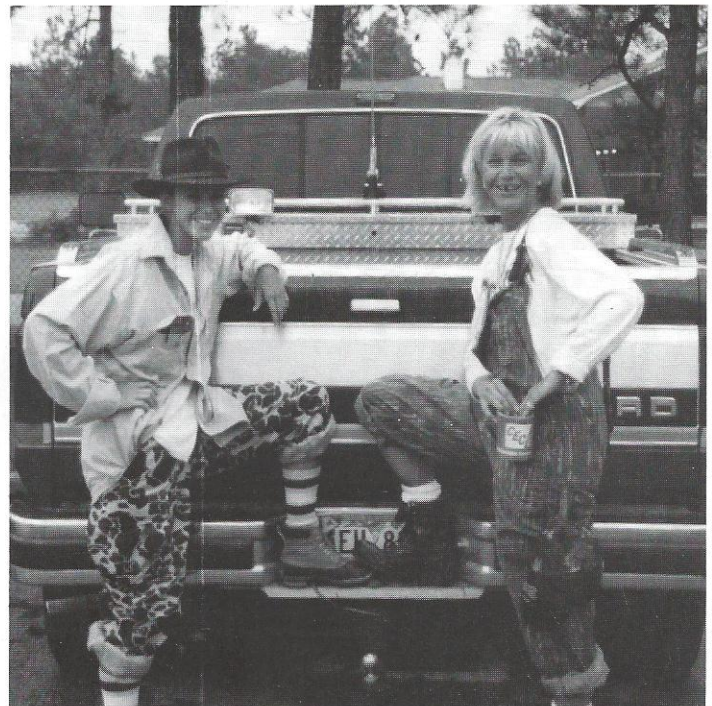
**Catch the spirit . . .** These fourth graders, dressed as spirit ribbons, are showing their support for the War Hawks at the skit competition.
