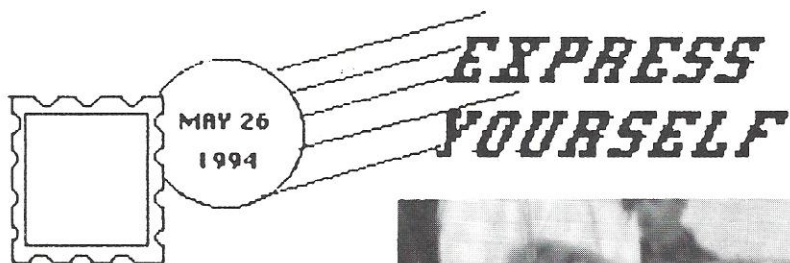
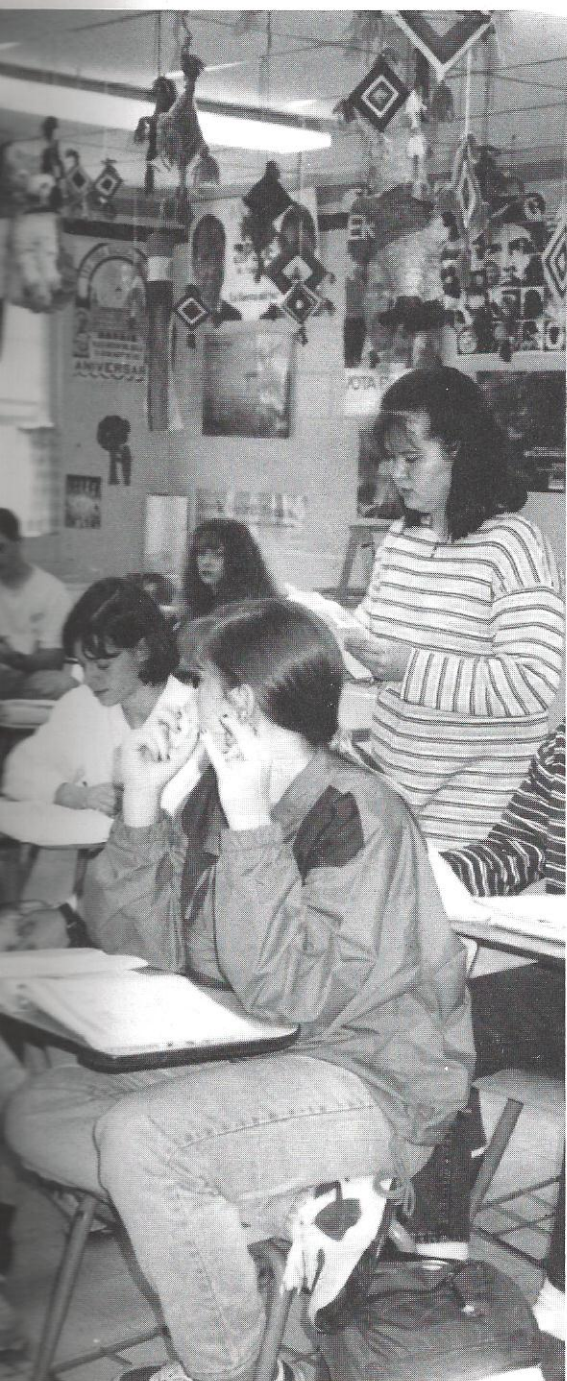
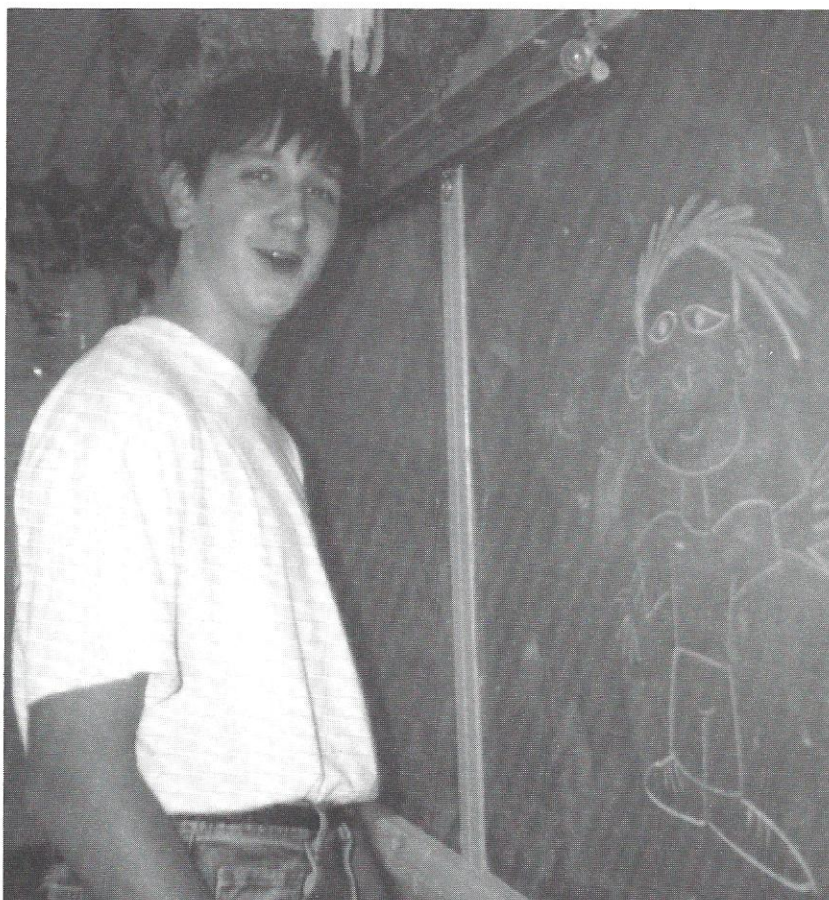


While in Mrs. Folk's class, the Sophomores study their notes about Spanish culture. Hopefully, she will not give them a quiz.
