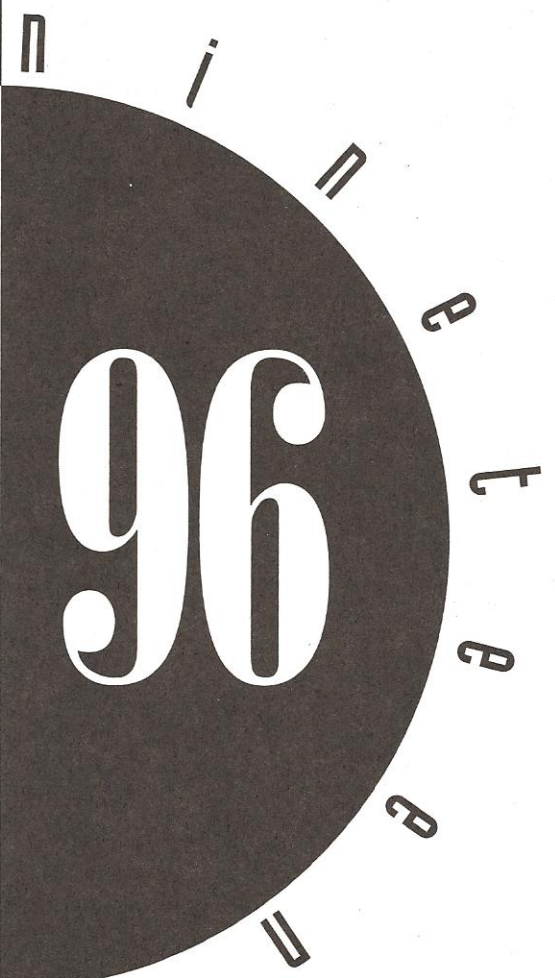

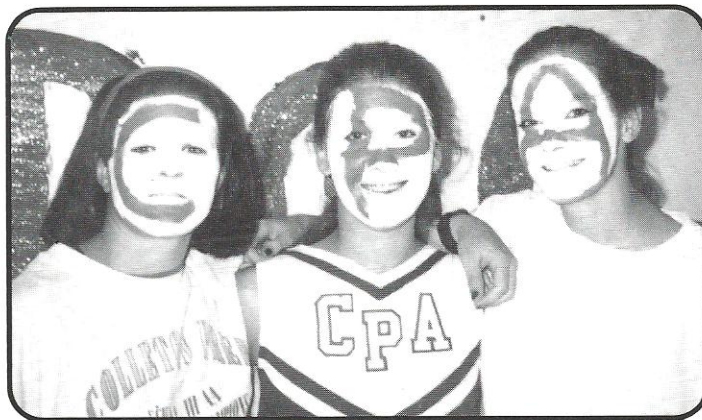

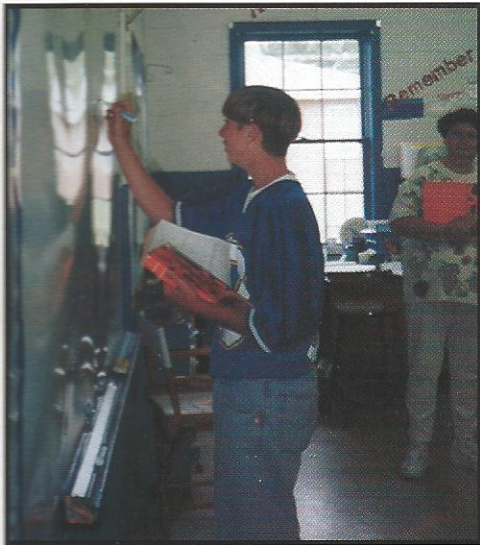

# Remember the Time

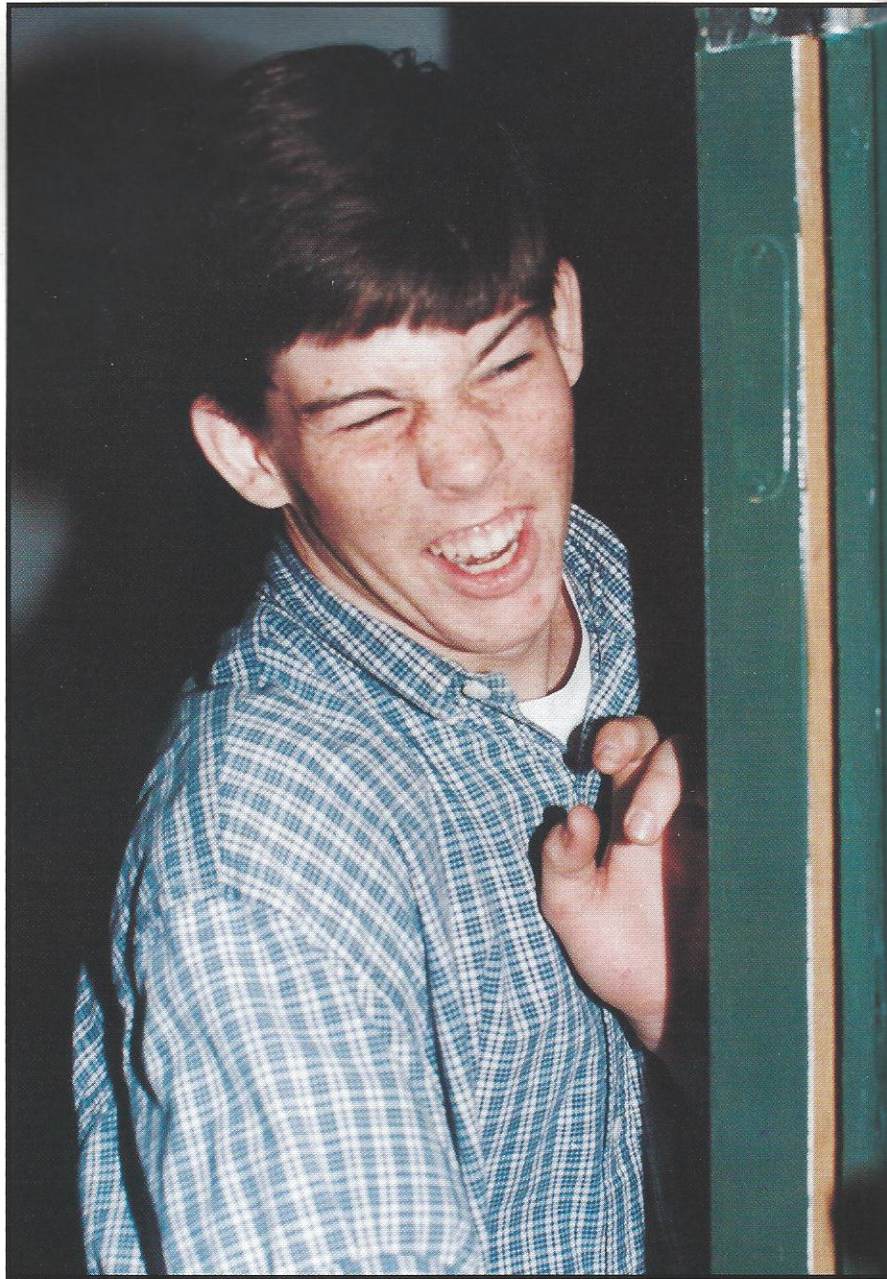

**Mathematical Murray.** Under Mrs. Fischer’s watchful eye, freshman Tommy Murray completes a math equation.



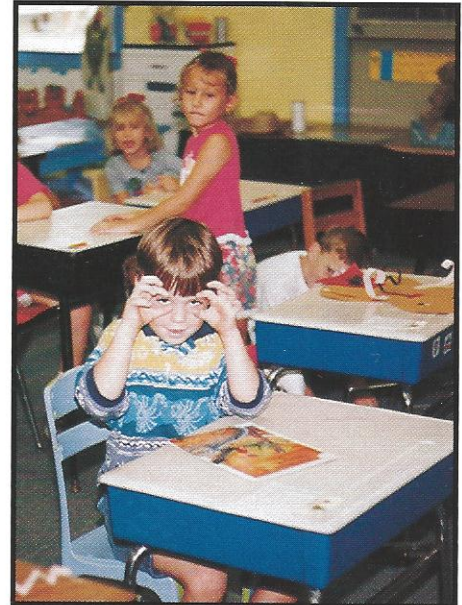

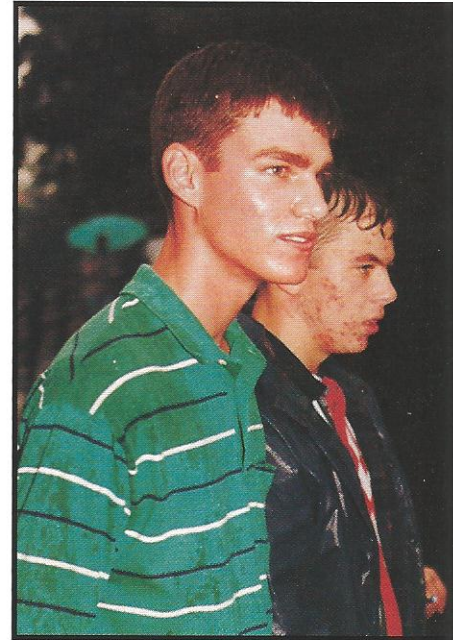
# Chuck-town and Cheese

The small crowd in attendance generously applauded the efforts of the production crew, indicating that this rare "showtime" was appreciated.

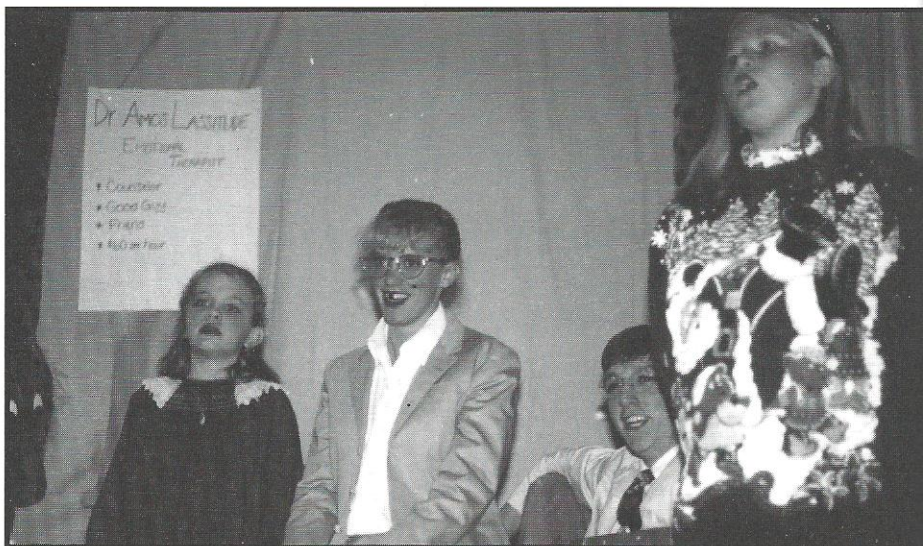


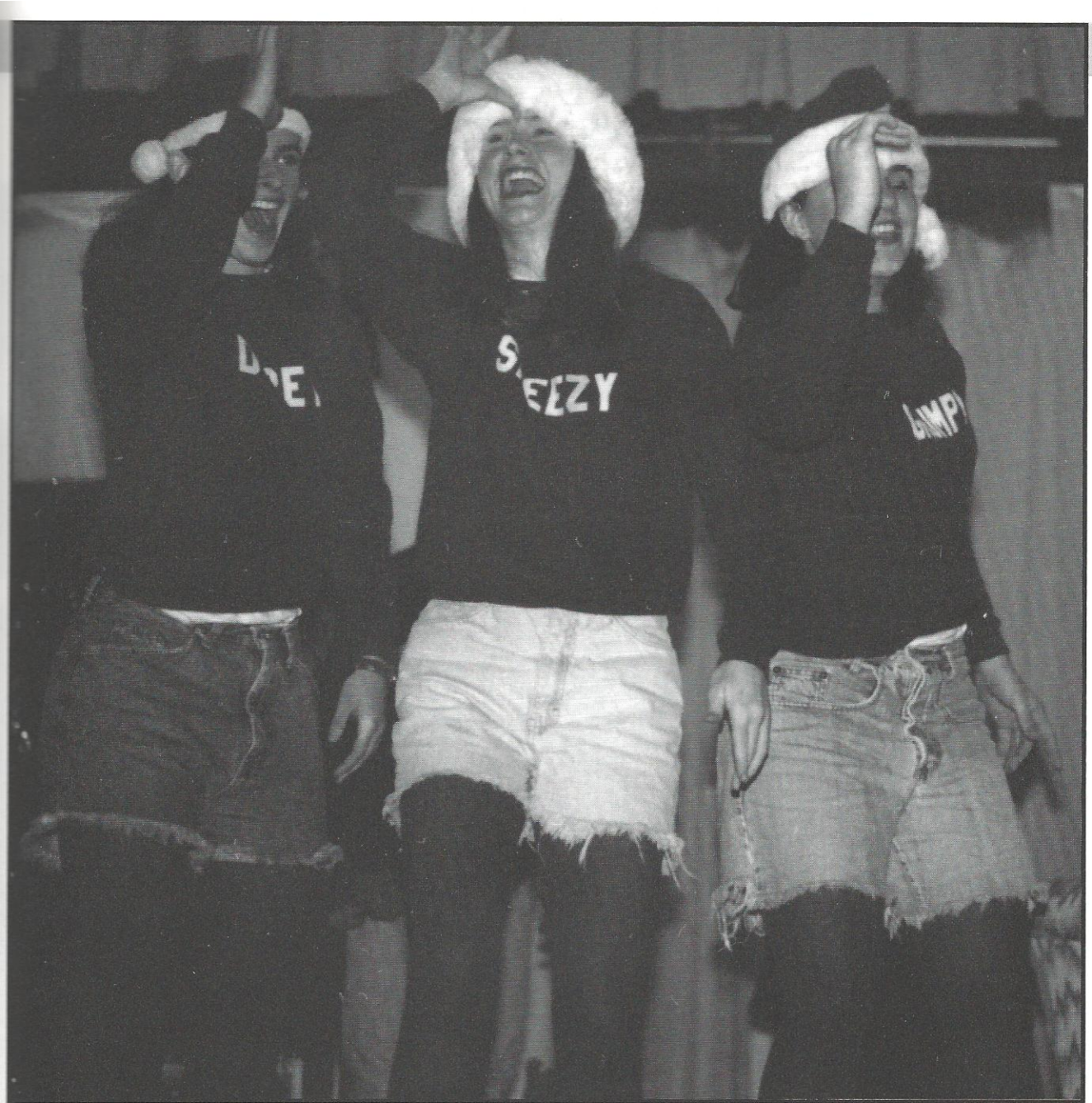

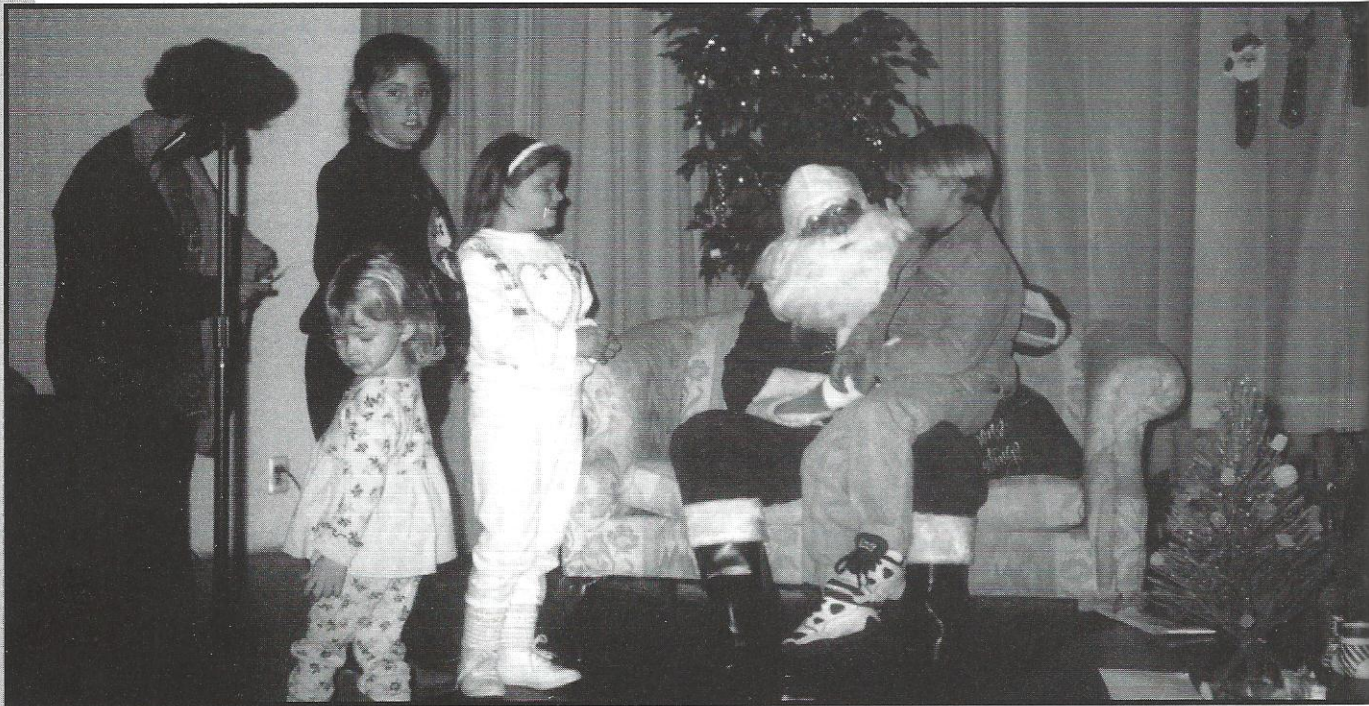
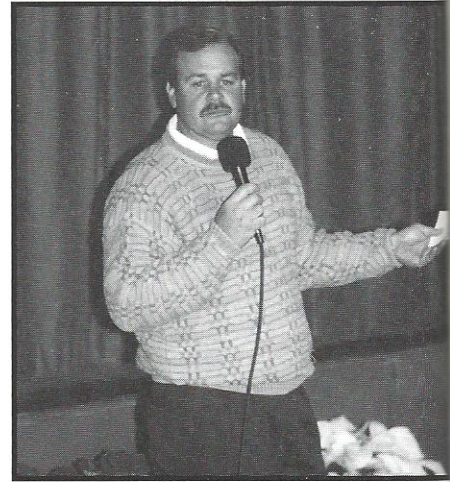
# Parent Teacher Organization

In addition to various fundraisers, the PTO also sponsored a dance for the middle school and helped produce the Christmas play, *Santa Sees a Shrink*.

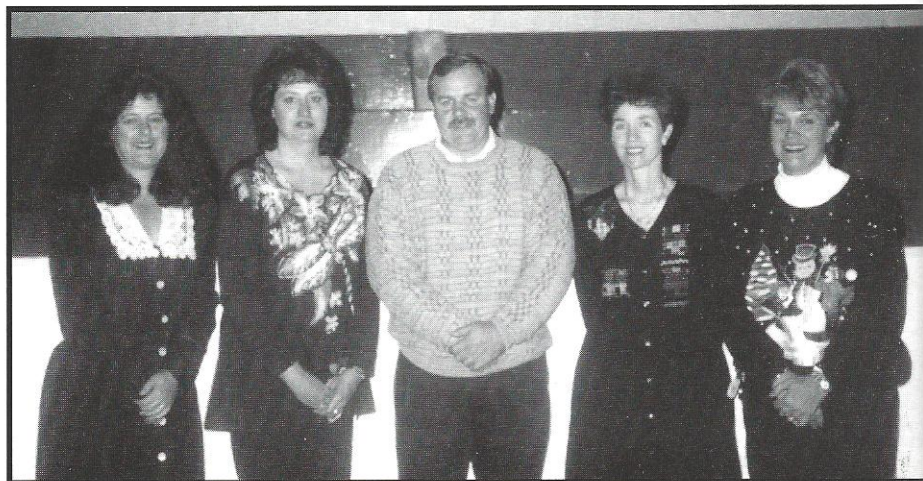

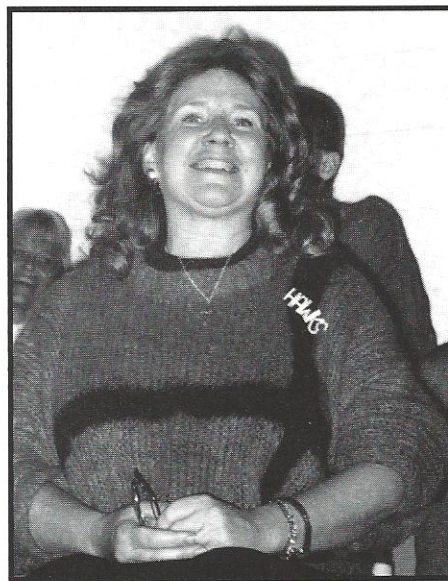
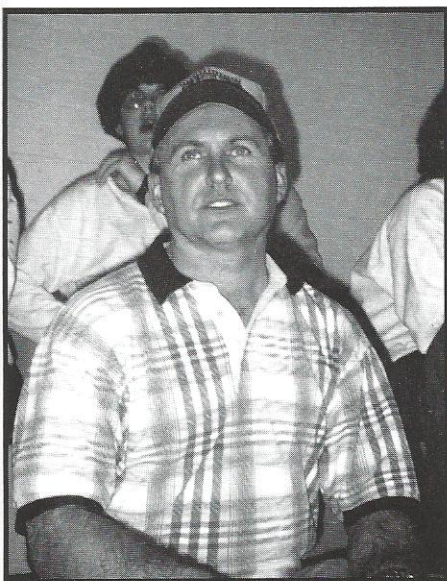
# The War Hawk Booster Club

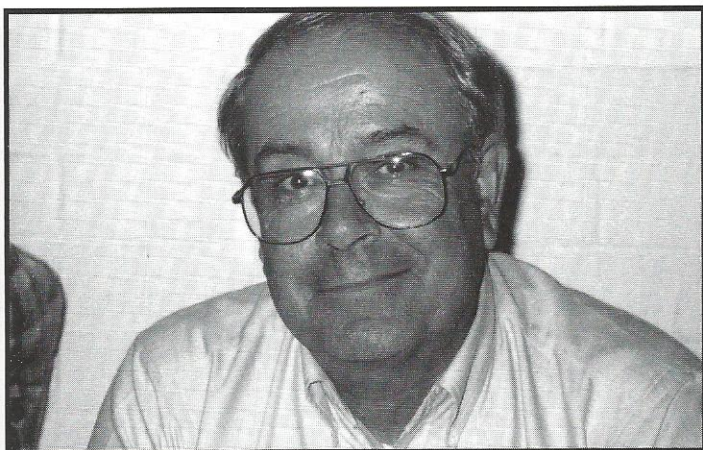

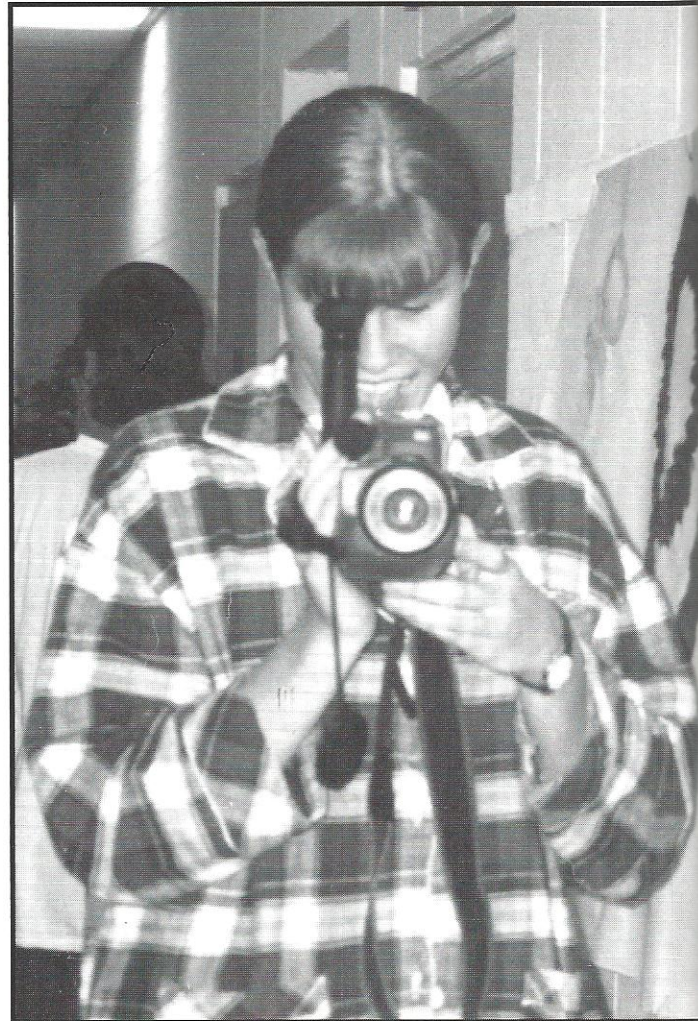
Herndon and Melanie Hoat valiantly organize class portrait days; and Cara Valentine—well, Cara smiles and rounds up the organization for last-minute photos.

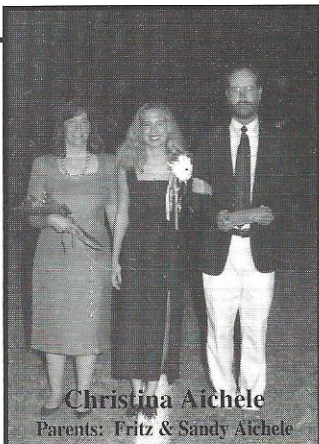

The 27th volume of the TALON, the official yearbook of Colleton Preparatory Academy, was designed and prepared by members of the 1996 TALON staff and faculty advisor, Mr. Dale Dittmer, using a Power Macintosh 6100/66 computer, Aldus PageMaker 5.0, and Jostens' Yeartech software program. The printing was done by Jostens Printing & Publishing in Clarksville, TN by the offset lithography process. All printing and cover production was done at this one facility. Jostens' local representative to CPA is Jack Young of Mt. Pleasant, S.C.

All 164 pages were printed on 80# double coated high gloss Mead enamel paper. The "WorldBeat" magazine section was prepared by WorldBook encyclopedia and Jostens and printed in full process color on 80# gloss enamel. The cover is custom designed litho pictorial with royal blue 287 and black tempo inks, and two units of special spangle foil application. Gloss laminated finish applied. The endsheets are 65# weight Snow white with #280 Transicolor with school design in black ink different from front and back.

Type styles are as follows: body and caption copy, 10 and 12 pt. Times; sub-headlines and main headlines, 14 and 36 pt. Times; thematic headlines, 40 pt. Poster Bondi compressed.

K-11 portraits were taken by Strawbridge Studios, Inc.; senior/special portraits were taken by Bill Bone.

The 1996 TALON had a press run of 275 copies.

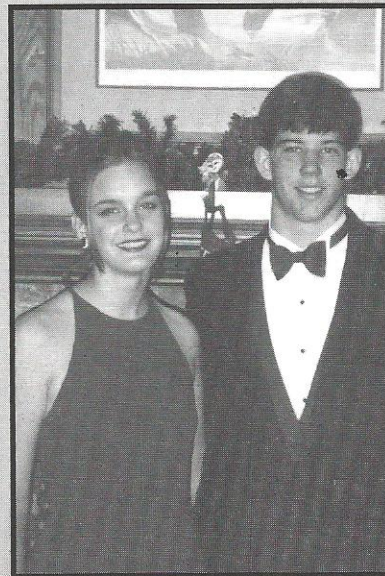

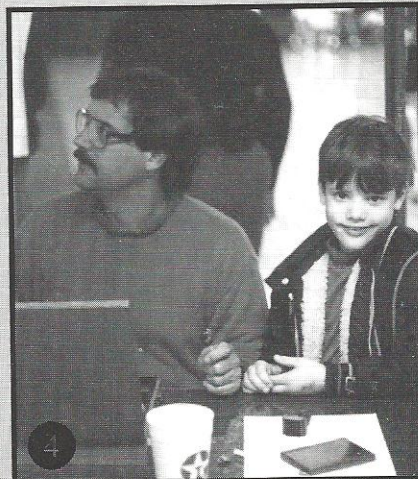
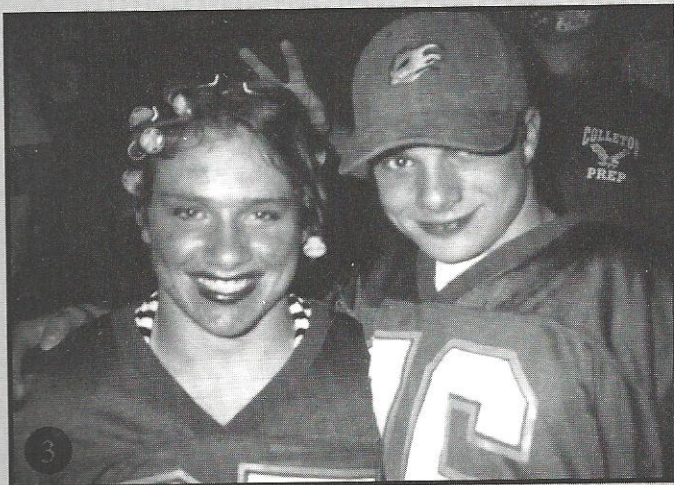
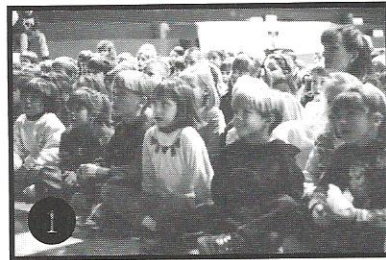


# Remember the Time . . . Once More

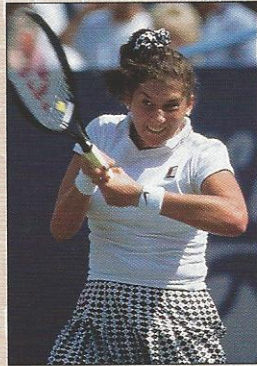
