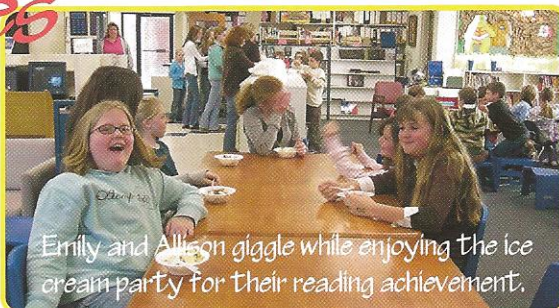

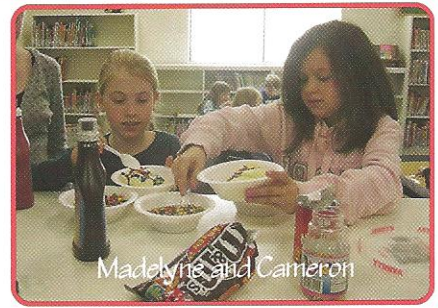

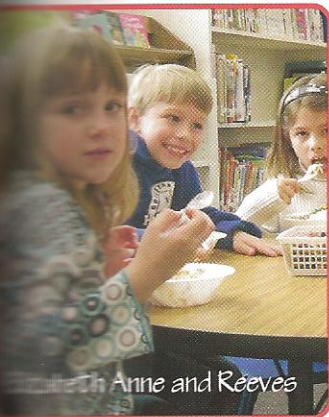

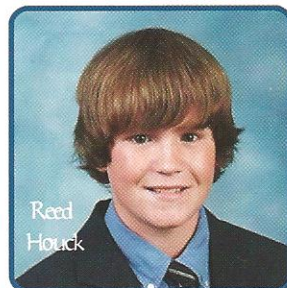

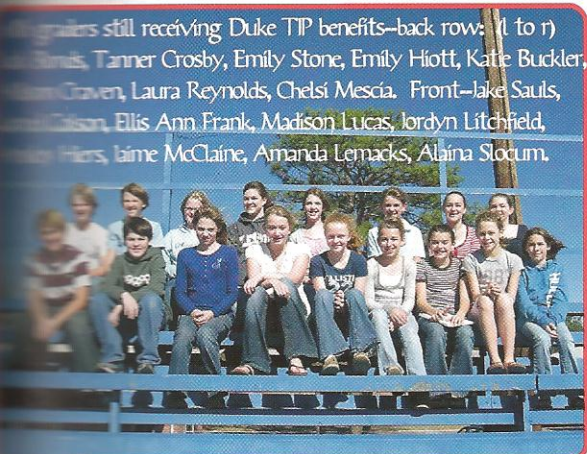
DUKE TIP

The Duke 4th/5th Grade Talent Search selects 4th/5th grade students who score in the 90th percentile or above on a standardized test and live in the TIP's 16 state search region. 7th grade students who are eligible to participate in the Duke Talent Identification Program (TIP) must have scored at or above the 95th percentile on a standardized math, verbal or total composite of an achievement or aptitude test. They also accepted the challenge of taking the SAT. In 2007, *Reed Houck* and John Carson won state recognition for scoring 500 or higher on at least one section of the test.
