

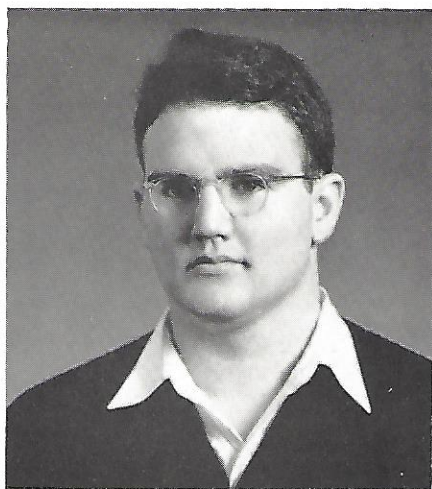
SHANNON, *Back*
