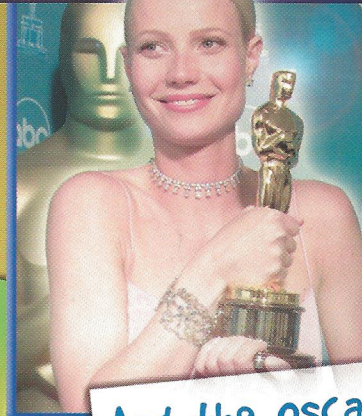
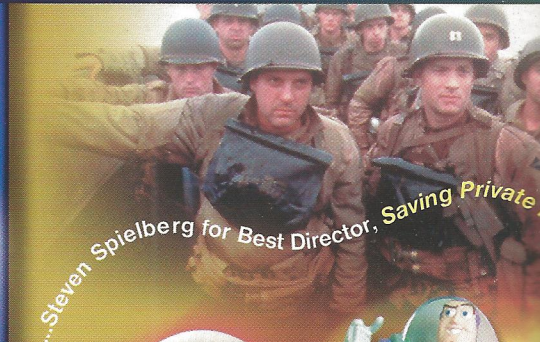


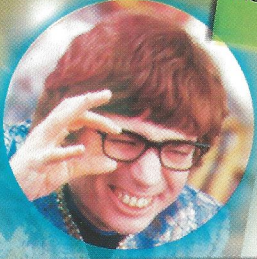
John Lithgow holds up his Emmy award for Best Actor in a comedy series, *3rd Rock From the Sun*. It's his third Emmy for the series!



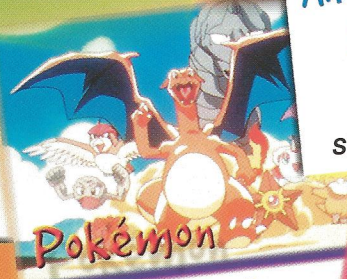
And the oscar goes to...
...Gwyneth Paltrow for best actress in *Shakespeare in Love*.



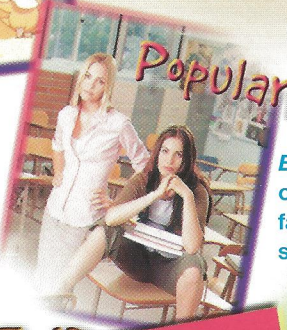
...Stevan Spielberg for Best Director, *Saving Private Ryan*.

Warner Brothers film, *Pokémon* follows Pikachu and pals to a remote island where they face battle with the "world's most powerful Pokémon," Mewtwo!



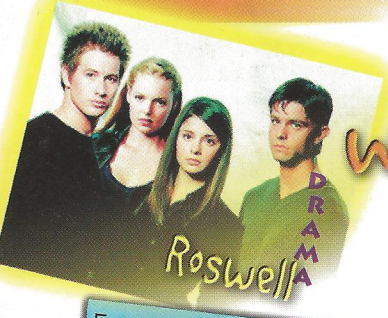
WB's *Popular*, a new series exploring the quest for popularity and acceptance within a high school teen caste system.



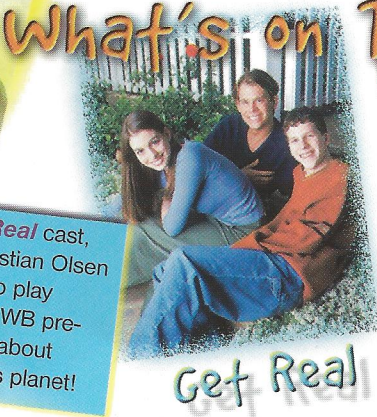
STAR WARS
Episode I, The Phantom Menace, opened in theaters May 21 giving fans their first new "Star Wars" fix since 1983's *Return of the Jedi*.



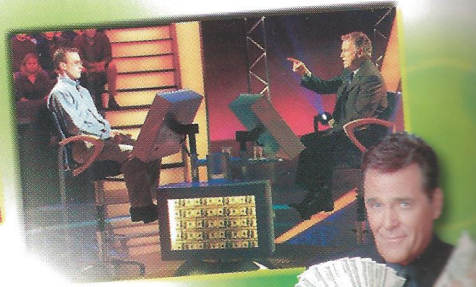
Toy Story 2 hit theaters at Thanksgiving. Buzz Lightyear's box office sale "To Infinity and Beyond!"

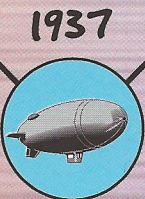

The Hindenberg, the largest airship ever built, explodes killing 36 people following a 60-hour transatlantic flight from Germany to New Jersey.



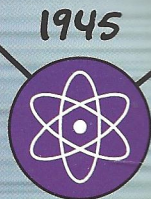
1939
