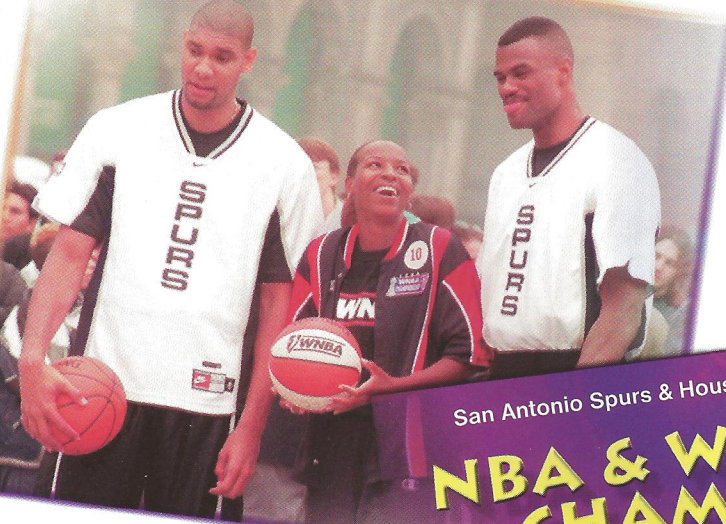

U.S. President John F. Kennedy is assassinated in Dallas, TX. The Kennedy Presidency brought a cultured and glamorous era to American politics known as "Camelot."

The Beatles make their American debut on the "Ed Sullivan Show," watched by more than 70 million viewers. "Beatlemania" swept the charts with 20 number one hits and more than 100 million records sold.
