




JIMMY BEACH - an old John C'er from way back. A real hunting freak. Next to hunting, he likes Chemistry best!








CATHY CROSBY - she and Julie have taken turns being class beauty. Always takes great pleasure in helping others - and always does more than her share of their work.


JIM GENTRY - our scientific genius. Has a thing about guns. Co-editor of "The Warhawk" and a member of the National Honor Society. Also a nut.

JOHN PADGETT - drives the big, bad, blue truck. "Will you please tell John he's left his lights on?" The big snow man.










The Booster Club







Some parents joined in the fun - and a few worked for weeks, faithfully, diligently, and cheerfully. They were good providers of cokes and cookies, too!













Graduation 1973
