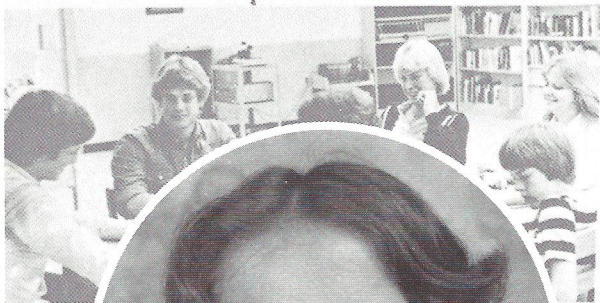

Student Council.

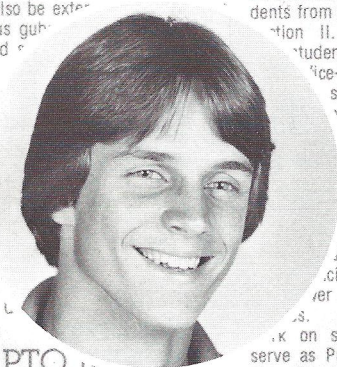

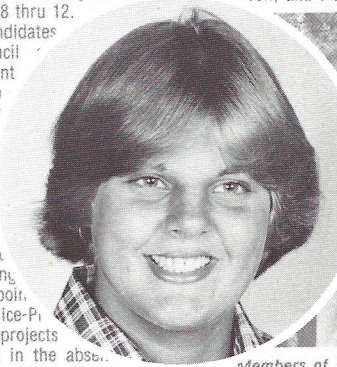

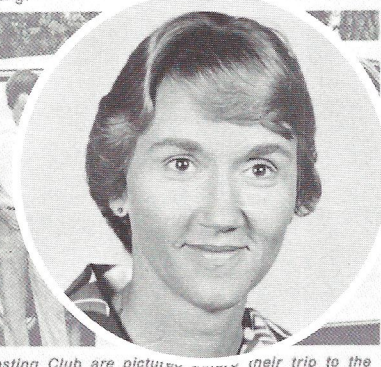
