
















THE BROADCASTING CLUB




THE WARHAWK is the academy newspaper published six times a year. With its own photographer and dark room, the paper is able to chronicle the events that involve and interest the students.

The final issue each year focuses on the graduating class.












The third annual Powder-Puff game between the girls of the twelfth and eleventh grades, assisted by their sister classes, took place on a cold night in December.



The second big money-making project of the PTO is the Halloween Carnival. Co-chairmen for this event were Morris Pye and Richard Norton.

















































































