

# Expecting Great Things . . .

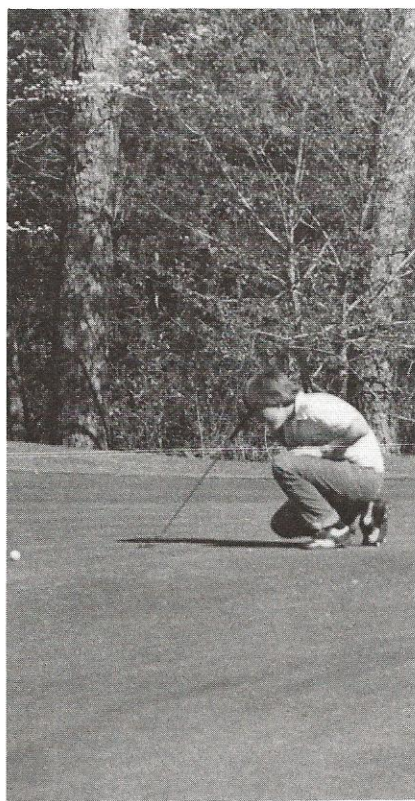
